A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.I.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, by the Ottawa Mint Proclamation, 1907, proclaimed, directed and ordained the establishment of a branch of Our Mint in England at or near Ottawa in Our Dominion of Canada:

And whereas by virtue of the said section it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made in pursuance of that section:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable that the establishment of the said branch Mint shall be discontinued, having regard to the fact that Our Ministers in Our Dominion of Canada have requested the discontinuance thereof and that provision has been made by the Parliament of Our said Dominion for the minting of coin in Our said Dominion:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The establishment of the branch of Our Royal Mint in England at or near Ottawa in

Our Dominion of Canada shall, as from the first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, be discontinued, and the Ottawa Mint Proclamation, 1907, shall, as from that date, cease to have effect:

Provided that nothing in this Proclamation shall affect anything legally done or suffered before that date, and all coins coined at the said branch Mint before that date which are at that date current and a legal tender in any part of Our dominions shall not, by reason of this Proclamation, cease to be so current and a legal tender.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Ottawa Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1931.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and in the twenty-second year of Our reign.
