ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS
1882 TO 1928.WESTMORLAND AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY
SPECIAL ORDER 1931.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister of Transport for confirmation under the above-mentioned Acts a Special Order made by them to be granted to Thomas Wilkinson (Arnside) Limited for the supply of electricity within the Borough of Appleby, the Urban Districts of Kirkby Lonsdale and Shap, the Rural Districts of East Westmorland and West Ward and part of the Rural District of South Westmorland in the County of Westmorland and the Urban District of Carnforth and part of the Rural District of Lancaster in the County Palatine of Lancaster.
