# LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (GENERAL POWERS).

**T**HE London County Council have applied to Parliament in the present session for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") under the short title of "London County Council (General Powers)" the title of the Bill being "A Bill to confer further powers upon the London County Council and other authorities and for other purposes".

A notice containing a concise summary of the purposes of the Bill has been or will be published in full in the Morning Post newspaper on the 3rd and 10th days of December instant.

A copy of the Bill may be inspected and copies thereof may be obtained at a price not exceeding two shillings and sixpence each at the offices of the undersigned Parliamentary Officer and Parliamentary Agents.

Plans showing the lands and premises which may be compulsorily acquired under powers sought by the Bill together with a book of reference to such plans were on the 19th day of November last deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the London County Council at the County Hall, Westminster Bridge, S.E. 1, and on the same date a copy of so much of the said plans and book of reference as relates to the following areas was deposited as follows:—

So far as relates to the metropolitan borough of Finsbury, with the Town Clerk of that borough at the Town Hall, Rosebery Avenue, E.C. 1; and

So far as relates to the metropolitan borough of Woolwich, with the Town Clerk of that borough at the Town Hall, Woolwich, S.E. 18.

# SOUTHERN RAILWAY.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that application has been made to Parliament in the present Session by the Southern Railway Company for an Act under the above name or short title intituled "A Bill to empower the Southern Railway Company to construct Works and acquire Lands; to extend the time for the completion of a Railway and the compulsory purchase of certain Lands; and for other purposes."
