Venice, March 14. N. S.

The great Convoy designed for the Levant will be ready to sail in a very short time. The St. Domingo Man of War arrived here last Thursday, having on Board Signior Alexander Molinos, who was in Naples at Romania on the 16th of February, Captain-General Cornaro, his Succesor, being arrived there the 12th, and having taken upon him the Command of the Venetian Forces: This Ship brings no manner of News, all things being very quiet in the Morea. Another of our Men of War is sailed hence for Cefalonia, to bring home Signior Antonio Molinos, General of the Islands, whose Commission being expired, he is preparing for his return. We hear the Viceroy of Naples has by order of his Catholic Majesty restored the Island of Ponza to the Duke of Lysa. The Muscovite General Sereemet left this place on Wednesday.

Dantzick, March 22. The King of Poland having left Lubembourg on the 17th instant, came the same afternoon to Country-Houle near this place, where he was received by some of our Magistrates, and lay that night. The next day his Majesty, attended by the Chancellor Danhof, Great Treasurer of the Crown, the Chancellor Sapieha, six Bishops, of Kiow and Ploisko, and several other Nobles of Quality, with our Senate, and principal inhabitants, (who went early in the morning to wait on him) made his publick Entry into this City, being received by the Burghers and Garison in Arms, and with a noble Discharge of our Artillery. The King is splendidly entertained by this City, who omit nothing that can express their Respect for his Majesty's Person and Zeal for his Service. The King went yesterday to Olivia, to the Place where the Prince of Conti landed; and thence he will make a turn to Putzck, to visit the Fortifications of that Place, and that soon after Easter he intends a return to Warsaw.

Vizna, March 19. Our Court is at present chiefly employed in hastening the necessary Orders for encreasing and maintaining our Forces; to which end, several Treaties are made with the Princes of Germany, and Recruits from the neighboring Countries march daily towards Hungary. Orders have been dispatched to the Regiments of Stirum, Gausfeldt, and Serini, to march into Poland to join the King's Forces. We hear from the Frontiers, That a Party of our Men have taken several Turks who were employed by the Commander of Belgrade to cut down Pallisadoes at the Fortifications intended to be raised there, and at Belgrade: And that a Party of 200 German Horse, which were sent to make an Incurion towards Bagnaluca, was returned with a considerable Booty, and some Prisoners, among whom was an Aga, who had been dispatched by the Commander of Belgrade, to give several Orders at Bagnaluca, and from thence to go to Bihatz, and take from him the Government of that place, vacant by the death of the Bassa who Commanded there before. Our Letters from Caranzebes advise us, That a Party sent out towards the Temes, had met with one of the Enemies who were attempting to pass that River, in order to bring some Troops into Temeswar, and falling upon them, took several Prisoners, and put the rest to flight.

Berlin, March 25. Mr. Stepany, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great Britain, arrived here the 14th instant, and on the 16th had his publick Audience with the usual Ceremonies, and has been since visited by most of the publick Ministers of this Court. Monsieur Hamilton continues a Prisoner at Peitsch. The Chancellor of Minden his Brother, his Electoral Highness's Minister at the late Conferences at Pynemberg, for adjusting the Differences between the Court of Denmark and the Duke of Holstein, is recalled to Court; as is likewise Monsieur Falajens, the Electors Envoy at the Court of Denmark. Our last Letters from Dantzick, which are of the 12th inst. say, The King of Poland intended to stay there 10 or 12 days longer, being very well satisfied with the Return he has from that City. Count Camitz went hence on the 10th for the Hague, being appointed to Reside there as Envoy Extraordinary from this Court.

Francfort, March 26. The French have delayed the Evacuation of Philipsbourg, in expectation that some Pacation should be Authorised by the Empire as well as by the Emperor, to take possession of the same; to remove which Difficulty, we hear, the Diet at Ratisbonne have resolved to give Prince Lewis of Baden the necessary Powers, and that an Instrument is ordered to be drawn up to that effect. The Deputies of the Circle of the Upper Rhine, being all arrived here, they opened their Assembly yesterday, and have already entred upon the Consideration of the Supplies demanded of them towards maintaining the Garison of Philipsbourg. Count Nassau Weylbrug, General of the Elector Palatine's Forces arrived here last Sunday. The C. de Boineburg, his Imperial Majesty's Commissioner, having been at Naremburg, and at the Court of the Elector of Mentz, to Negotiate a Treaty for some Troops to be sent by the Elector, as likewise by the Circle of Franconia into the Emperor's Service, returned hither some days ago. Don Pathiecs, Envoy of Portugal, who came lately from the Hague, is gone hence on his way to Vienna.

Hamburg, March 28. The Prince and Princess of Wolfembattel came hither last Tuesday to take their Leaves of the Duke of Holstein, who designs in 5 or 6 days to begin his Journey to Stockholm, in order to his intended Marriage with the King of Sweden's Sister. Major-General Ranzow died here some days ago in the 60th year of his Age of the Wounds he had received in a Duel with Colonel Ranzau. Mr. Cresset, Envoy Extraordinary from His Majesty of Great Britain, intends shortly to go hence to the Courts of Hanover and Zell. We hear from Copenhagen, That Monsieur de Falaiseau, who Resided there on the part of the Elector of Brandenburg, would shortly leave that place in order to return to Berlin; and that the Duke of Wirtemberg has lately taken a Review of most of the Forces of that Crown, in order to make a Report to the King of Denmark of the Condition they are in. Our last Advices from Poland say, The Disorders of that Kingdom are still very great, and that there is little likelihood of putting things on a better foot, before the meeting of the General Diet, which is to be held the 16th of April. We hear some Intimation has been given to the City of Dantzick, That the French King expects they should, by a formal Deputation, make their Submission to him, on the account of what passed at the landing of the Prince of Conti; and that the whole Magistracy were to meet the 24th instant, in order to Consult what Resolutions might be proper for them to take in this matter, wherein they will be chiefly guided by the Directions of the King of Poland, who is now there.

Brussels, March 31. The Prince and Princess of Vaudemont went last Thursday to Neibsn, whence they are to set out to morrow on their Journey to Milan, by the way of Paris. The Count de Roelze has also left this place, and is gone to take possession of his Government of Mons, and to enter upon the Function of his Office as Great Bayliff of
