TREASURY MINUTE DATED THE 14TH DECEMBER, 1931.

My Lords read Section 8 of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1928.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer informs the Board that the Governor and Company of the Bank of England have represented to him that it is in their opinion expedient that the amount of the fiduciary note issue be maintained at 275 million pounds, to which it was increased under the authority of Treasury Minutes dated the 1st August, 1931, the 21st August, 1931, the 11th September, 1931, the 2nd October, 1931, the 30th October, 1931, and the 30th November, 1931. He proposes accordingly that the authority to the Bank to issue fiduciary bank notes to the total amount of 275 million pounds should be further extended until the 31st January, 1932.

My Lords approve and direct that the Bank of England be notified accordingly.
