purposes to the said Parish of Fakenham Magna.

"4. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £300 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"5. That upon the union taking effect (1) the Parsonage House situate at Euston at present belonging to the said Benefice of Euston with Barnham and Fakenham Parva shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and (2) the Parsonage House or glebe house situate at Barnham, at present belonging to the said Benefice of Euston with Barnham and Fakenham Parva, shall form part of the endowments of the United Benefice but shall be used for the purpose of a house of residence for the Curate referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme unless the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being shall at any time by writing otherwise direct.

"6. That upon the first vacation of the United Benefice a portion of the endowments or property of the Benefices by this Scheme proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, namely the whole of the net proceeds of the sale of the former Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Fakenham Magna, which said proceeds are held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty, shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Fakenham Magna and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated for the benefit of the Benefice of Sapiston, situate in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England,

or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 15th day of October, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Laira, situate within the Parish of Egg Buckland, in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Egg Buckland, of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Plymouth, and of an Extra Augustine, Plymouth, and of an Extra Parochial Place situate on the western bank of the River Plym, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain configuous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Egg Buckland, of the said New Parish of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, and of the said Extra Parochial Place,
