"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of Prize Money to Royal Marines for proficiency in shooting with Lewis and Machine Guns on the following scale as from 11th August, 1931 :—

Weapon.	Scale.
Lewis Gun ...	10s. for Marksman and 1d. a point for each point above the score required to qualify as Marksman in the prescribed Army Annual Range Course.
Machine Gun ...	11s. for Marksman (with no additions).

(Prize Money in any one training year to be paid only in respect of one Weapon Training Course, i.e., with Rifle, Lewis or Machine Gun.)

"And whereas the total number of Warrant Mechanicians and above is at present insufficient to allow of a promotion to the rank of Lieutenant (E) being made in accordance with the regulation that the number of Officers of the rank of Lieutenant in each category shall be limited to 8 per cent. of the total number of Officers in that category:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to grant us discretionary powers to make not more than one promotion to the rank of Lieutenant (E) from the ranks of Commissioned Mechanician and Warrant Mechanician so long as the number of Officers holding these ranks remains insufficient to admit of such a promotion under the regulation whereby the number of Officers to be promoted in this way is limited to 8 per cent. of the total number of Officers in each category.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of November, 1931, (C.W. 1301/30), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council, dated the fourth day of July, 1895, certain provisions are made for the voluntary re-employment of Retired Officers of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines:

"And whereas we consider that provision should also be made for the grant of full pay sick leave to such officers who may fall sick during voluntary re-employment:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us at our discretion to grant full pay sick leave to Retired Officers of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines who fall sick whilst voluntarily re-employed, within the limits and subject to the provisions set forth in the attached Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"REGULATIONS FOR THE GRANT OF FULL PAY DURING SICKNESS TO RETIRED OFFICERS VOLUNTARILY RE-EMPLOYED.

"Retired Officers who, whilst voluntarily re-employed and borne for full pay on the books of one of H.M. Ships or Royal Marine Divisions, become unfit for duty may at the discretion of the Admiralty continue to receive full pay during the period of their disablement subject to the conditions and within the limits prescribed hereunder:—

"I. Full Pay shall not be issuable under these Regulations:—

(a) After the date on which the appointment held by the officer when he fell sick would normally have terminated (except as provided in Rule 5 of this Schedule).

(b) After the date on which the officer is certified as fit to resume civil employment suitable to his age.

(c) After the date on which it is certified that there is no longer reasonable probability that he will again be found fit to perform duty in his Naval appointment (except as provided for in Rule IV of this Schedule).

"II. Subject to the above:—

(a) An Officer who during his re-employment sustains an injury on duty not due to

his own default, or is shown to the satisfaction of the Admiralty to be suffering from sickness due to the conditions of Naval Service, may continue in receipt of full pay during disablement for a period not exceeding 18 months.

(b) An Officer suffering from injury or sickness not attributable to the conditions of service, nor due to his own negligence or misconduct or any cause within his own control, may continue in receipt of full pay during disablement for periods not exceeding:—

If the appointment be for one month or less	7 days.
If the appointment exceed one month, but not two months...	14 days.
If the appointment exceed two months but be less than three months	21 days.
If the appointment be for three months or over, but not more than six months...	42 days.
If the appointment be for more than six months...	121 days.

(c) An Officer suffering from injury or sickness due to his own negligence or misconduct or any cause within his own control may continue in receipt of full pay during disablement for periods not exceeding:—

If the appointment be for less than three months	Nil.
If the appointment be of three months or more but not more than six months	21 days.
If the appointment be for more than six months	42 days.

“ III. For the purpose of Rule II, (b) and (c), when the period for which an Officer is appointed is indefinite and would not necessarily exceed six months, he is at first to be regarded as appointed for less than three months. After he has completed that period of service he is to be regarded as appointed for not more than six months and only after completing six months' service in the appointment is he to be regarded as eligible for the maximum periods laid down. The length of the period in respect of which full pay has been granted in the appointment reckoned up to the date checked sick will determine into which of these categories the officer shall be placed.

“ IV. As an exception to Rule I (c), an Officer appointed for a period of not less than six months who is found to be permanently unfit for service on account of injury or sickness directly attributable to the conditions of his service during re-employment or on account of tuberculosis or insanity aggravated thereby, may, in special circumstances and at the discretion of the Admiralty, continue in receipt of full pay for a period not exceeding three months from the date of the medical report certifying that there is no longer any reasonable probability of ultimate fitness for return to duty in his appointment, provided that full pay be in no case extended beyond the date on which:—

(a) his appointment would normally terminate;

(b) he is found fit to resume civil employment suitable to his age;

(c) the maximum period allowable under Rule II has been completed.

“ V. Unless the Admiralty shall direct otherwise in any particular case, an officer domiciled in the United Kingdom who may be disabled whilst serving abroad shall not be surveyed with a view to determining whether a reasonable probability of his ultimate return to duty has ceased to exist until after his arrival in the United Kingdom, nor shall his full pay cease before such arrival, notwithstanding that the limits of full pay during sickness as prescribed in these Regulations may be thereby exceeded and that the normal term of his appointment may have expired previously, provided always that

(a) his disablement be not due to his own negligence or misconduct or any cause within his own control, and

(b) he return to the United Kingdom as soon as may be practicable after he has been found fit to travel.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

“ And whereas the Engineer Officer of the ship of the Senior Naval Officer, Persian Gulf, is required to carry out Divisional Engineering duties in addition to the duties in respect of which machinery allowance is payable under the above-quoted Order in Council:

“ And whereas we consider that in present circumstances the Officer so employed should receive a special allowance:

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 1st day of September, 1931, the pay-

ment to the Officer from time to time so employed of an allowance of 2s. a day, such payment to continue, provided that an independent Engineer Officer be not appointed for the duty, so long as the vessels maintained in the Persian Gulf are considered to warrant it.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said resolution and by virtue of all powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Architects (Registration) Act, 1931, shall extend to Northern Ireland.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 E. 7, c. 29; 4-5 G. 5, c. 18; 9-10 G. 5, c. 80, and 18-9 G. 5, c. 3), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of

certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Poland has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Poland the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Poland or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 25th day of November, 1919 (S.R. & O. 1919 (No. 1900) p. 106), His Majesty was pleased to declare that the provisions of the said Section 91 should apply to Poland, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Poland confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Poland or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Poland.

3. The Order in Council dated the 25th day of November, 1919, relating to Poland is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Poland) Order, 1931.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and

now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an alteration of the boundaries of the Parishes of the Benefices of Chalgrave, Hockliffe and Tilsworth, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Bedford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report *inter alia* upon an alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Chalgrave and Hockliffe duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Albans and therein recommended the said alteration of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same including a further alteration of boundaries affecting the said Parish of Tilsworth and the said Bishop of Saint Albans signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Chalgrave is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Barton Tatham, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hockliffe (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Hockliffe all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Chalgrave which is now situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Hockliffe.

"2. That with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, as Patron of the said Benefice of Tilsworth (testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Reverend Edward Reinagle Souper, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tilsworth (testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Thomas Barton Tatham (testified as aforesaid), upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Hockliffe all that contiguous part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Tilsworth containing Bull Farm lying on the south western side of Watling Street and having a frontage on Watling Street of approximately half a mile and an approximate average depth from Watling Street of 370 yards, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan annexed hereto and is thereon coloured pink.

"3. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme a part of the endowment of the said Benefice of Chalgrave, namely a sum of

£15 per annum (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Chalgrave) shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Hockliffe.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Albans has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 12th day of November, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen

Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Banstead, partly out of the Parish of Ewell, and partly out of the Parish of Cuddington, all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Banstead, the said Parish of Ewell, and the said Parish of Cuddington are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Banstead, of the said Parish of Ewell, and of the said Parish of Cuddington which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Guildford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Banstead, of the said Parish of Ewell, and of the said Parish of Cuddington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul, Nork.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Paul, Nork, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Banstead, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford, which is bounded upon part of the north by the Parish of Cuddington, upon another part of the north and upon the north west by the Parish of Ewell, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south west, upon the south east, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the north side of Yew Tree Bottom Road where the boundaries of the said Parish of Ewell, the Parish of Epsom, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Parish of Banstead, all meet and extending thence southward to and first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Yew Tree Bottom Road for a distance of 67 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church Lane and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Church Lane for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called The Drive and extending thence north eastward along the middle of The Drive for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brighton Road and extending thence northward along the middle of Brighton Road for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Brighton Road across the Sutton and Epsom Downs Line of the Southern Railway and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Banstead Road across such line of railway and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Banstead Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Banstead from the said Parish of Cuddington.

"II. "Whereas the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich now comprises two Archdeaconries, namely, the Archdeaconry of Sudbury and the Archdeaconry of Suffolk:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that a new Archdeaconry should be constituted within the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and should comprise and consist of certain Rural Deaneries at present within the said Archdeaconry of Sudbury and the said Archdeaconry of Suffolk, as set down in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that

such new Archdeaconry should be endowed in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas it appears to us to be undesirable that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees should be received by the Archdeacon of the said proposed new Archdeaconry:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that by reason of the discontinuance of the collection of the said fees there will be no annual income available for the said proposed Archdeaconry from fees, dues and emoluments, and that the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not be such as to raise the annual income of the said proposed Archdeaconry to an amount exceeding £300:

"And whereas there appears to be some uncertainty respecting the names of some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries and it appears to us to be desirable that the names of all the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries should now be definitely fixed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order one new Archdeaconry shall be created within the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and that such Archdeaconry shall be named 'The Archdeaconry of Ipswich' and shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of the Archdeaconry of Ipswich in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed:

"And we further recommend and propose that the Rural Deans and other the Clergy and the Inhabitants generally of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Ipswich shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction, authority and control of the Archdeacon of such proposed Archdeaconry for the time being, and that such Archdeacon shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and duties of an Archdeacon within the limits of his Archdeaconry:

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorised to pay by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July and the 1st day of October in every year out of the Common Fund created by the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Ipswich and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry the yearly sum of £300 the instalment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of £300 in respect of the period between the date of the collation of the first Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Ipswich and the first quarterly day of payment next ensuing: provided always, that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £300 shall

be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law :

“ And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of such proposed Archdeaconry and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon :

“ And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £300 shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry :

“ And we further recommend and propose that the names of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries shall be those set down in numbered order under the names of the respective Archdeaconries in the said Schedule hereunto annexed :

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or any of them.
