

Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Banstead, partly out of the Parish of Ewell, and partly out of the Parish of Cuddington, all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Banstead, the said Parish of Ewell, and the said Parish of Cuddington are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Banstead, of the said Parish of Ewell, and of the said Parish of Cuddington which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Guildford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Banstead, of the said Parish of Ewell, and of the said Parish of Cuddington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul, Nork.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Paul, Nork, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Banstead, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford, which is bounded upon part of the north by the Parish of Cuddington, upon another part of the north and upon the north west by the Parish of Ewell, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south west, upon the south east, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point on the north side of Yew Tree Bottom Road where the boundaries of the said Parish of Ewell, the Parish of Epsom, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Parish of Banstead, all meet and extending thence southward to and first eastward and then south eastward along the middle of Yew Tree Bottom Road for a distance of 67 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church Lane and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Church Lane for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called The Drive and extending thence north eastward along the middle of The Drive for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brighton Road and extending thence northward along the middle of Brighton Road for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Brighton Road across the Sutton and Epsom Downs Line of the Southern Railway and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Banstead Road across such line of railway and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Banstead Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Banstead from the said Parish of Cuddington.

"II. And also all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Ewell and the said Parish of Cuddington which taken together are bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west by the said Parish of Epsom, upon the south by the above described portion of the said Parish of Banstead, upon the east partly by another portion of the same Parish, partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Belmont and partly by the Parish of Cheam, both in the said County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Cheam from the said Parish of Cuddington crosses the middle of the proposed Carshalton and Epsom Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the last mentioned road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Cuddington from the said Parish of Ewell) for a distance of 1 mile 52 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Ewell from the said Parish of Epsom."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been
