**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of November, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a new Archdeaconry within the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and for endowing such new Archdeaconry:

“ Whereas the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich now comprises two Archdeaconries, namely, the Archdeaconry of Sudbury and the Archdeaconry of Suffolk:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that a new Archdeaconry should be constituted within the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and should comprise and consist of certain Rural Deaneries at present within the said Archdeaconry of Sudbury and the said Archdeaconry of Suffolk, as set down in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that

such new Archdeaconry should be endowed in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be undesirable that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees should be received by the Archdeacon of the said proposed new Archdeaconry:

“ And whereas it has been made to appear to us that by reason of the discontinuance of the collection of the said fees there will be no annual income available for the said proposed Archdeaconry from fees, dues and emoluments, and that the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not be such as to raise the annual income of the said proposed Archdeaconry to an amount exceeding £300:

“ And whereas there appears to be some uncertainty respecting the names of some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries and it appears to us to be desirable that the names of all the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries should now be definitely fixed:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order one new Archdeaconry shall be created within the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and that such Archdeaconry shall be named ‘The Archdeaconry of Ipswich’ and shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in numbered order under the name of the Archdeaconry of Ipswich in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed:

“ And we further recommend and propose that the Rural Deans and other the Clergy and the Inhabitants generally of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Ipswich shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction, authority and control of the Archdeacon of such proposed Archdeaconry for the time being, and that such Archdeacon shall have and exercise all the rights, powers and duties of an Archdeacon within the limits of his Archdeaconry:

“ And we further recommend and propose that we be authorised to pay by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July and the 1st day of October in every year out of the Common Fund created by the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Ipswich and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry the yearly sum of £300 the instalment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of £300 in respect of the period between the date of the collation of the first Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Ipswich and the first quarterly day of payment next ensuing: provided always, that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £300 shall
