

be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law :

“ And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of such proposed Archdeaconry and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon :

“ And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £300 shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry :

“ And we further recommend and propose that the names of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries shall be those set down in numbered order under the names of the respective Archdeaconries in the said Schedule hereunto annexed :

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms :—

“ I, John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, beg leave to represent to your Grace :—

“ That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament called ‘ The Pluralities Acts ’ the Extra Parochial place or district or portion of land known as ‘ The Haughmond Demesne ’ may be advantageously added to and be united for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Uffington in the County of Salop and Diocese of Lichfield to which it is contiguous as the spiritual care of the inhabitants thereof, numbering about one hundred and fifty, will thereby be more conveniently or effectually provided for more particularly as the Parish Church of Uffington is
