

about two miles from the centre of the said Demesne whereas the Mission Room at Ebrey Wood in the said Demesne is distant about three and a half miles by road from the said Parish Church.

"That pursuant to the directions of the twenty-sixth section of the Act 1 and 2 Victoria, Chapter 106, as amended by the Act 2 and 3 Victoria, Chapter 49, I have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, rent charges, and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews or sittings may be made with justice to all parties interested and I submit to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patron and the Incumbent of the said Parish of Uffington to the intent that your Grace may, if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme, certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed that the Extra Parochial place or district or portion of land known as 'The Haughmond Demesne' coloured pink on the accompanying Plan shall be annexed to and united with the Parish of Uffington in the said Diocese such Parish being edged green on the said Plan.

"That all Ecclesiastical offices shall be performed for the inhabitants of the said Demesne in the Parish Church of Uffington and that the fees for all such offices and all other Ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within the said Demesne shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Uffington.

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe lands Tithes or Tithe rent charges compositions in lieu of Tithes endowments or other annual payments of or belonging to the said Demesne nor in respect of Patronage.

"That the inhabitants of the said Demesne shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Uffington to which it is proposed that the said Demesne shall be annexed and in common with the Parishioners of that Parish.

"That the said Mission Room at Ebrey Wood aforesaid shall in future be treated as a Mission Church attached to the Parish Church of Uffington.

"We, John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, within whose Diocese the Parish of Uffington and the District known as Haughmond Demesne are situate, Hugh Dryden Corbet of Downton near Shrewsbury, Patron of the Benefice of Uffington, and Ernest Rackwitz Sequeira, Vicar of Uffington, do

hereby certify our Consents to the Scheme above proposed.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Guildford, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We, John, Bishop of Guildford, in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Surrey and our Diocese of Guildford the Vicarage or Benefice of Ewell the Parish whereof contains (according to the Census of 1921) a population of Four Thousand One Hundred and Eighty Seven or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for One Thousand and Forty Persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Ewell is Four Hundred and Fifty Seven Pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Cuddington the Parish whereof contains (according to the Census of 1921) a population of Seven Hundred and Nineteen or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for Two Hundred and Twenty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Cuddington is Three Hundred and Sixty Two Pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838:—

(1) A portion of the Parish of Ewell (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the Map attached to the hereinafter mentioned Scheme and thereon verged pink) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of Ewell and be annexed to the Parish of Cuddington to which it is contiguous.

(2) A portion of the Parish of Cuddington (the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the said Map and thereon verged green) may advantageously be separated from the Parish of Cuddington and be annexed to the Parish of Ewell to which it is contiguous.
