"Sir Arthur Robert Glyn, Baronet, is the Patron of the Benefice of Ewell and the Reverend Edward Cuthbert Usherwood is the present Incumbent thereof.

"We, John, by virtue of our Bishopric are the Patron of the Benefice of Cuddington and the Reverend Francis Edwin Lamb is the

present Incumbent thereof.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Ewell and Cuddington and also the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Ewell and annex to the Parish of Cuddington all that portion of the Parish of Ewell which is delineated on the Map hereto annexed and thereon verged pink.

"It is also proposed to separate from the Parish of Cuddington and annex to the Parish of Ewell all that portion of the Parish of Cuddington which is delineated on the said Map and thereon verged green.

"That the Incumbents of Ewell and Cuddington shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within those portions of the Parishes so to be separated from the Parishes of Ewell and Cuddington respectively and annexed to their respective Parishes.

"That the inhabitants of such portions so to be separated shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which the several portions are respectively separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in any or either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, solemnized and performed in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed as they might have had in the Parish Churches of the Parishes from which such portions were separated.

"That all fees, Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding Tithes if any) arising from the said portions so to be separated shall henceforth belong to the respective Incumbents of the Benefices to which such portions are respectively annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or any of

them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or any of them. "Dated this 10th day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.
