The KING has been pleased to appoint U Ba, Judge of the High Court of Judicature at Rangoon, to be a Member of the Executive Council of the Governor of Burma, in the place of Sir Joseph Augustus Maung Gyi, Knight, whose term of office will expire on the 1st January, 1932.

#### DERBY.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Derby (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Derby Corporation Act, 1929, so as:—

(1) To extend until the thirty-first day of October, 1934, the time limited by section 7 of the said Local Act for the compulsory purchase of the lands which the Corporation are by section 5 of the said Local Act authorised to acquire, but have not yet acquired:—

(a) for and in connection with the construction of the street works numbered 7, 8, 9 and 10 authorised by section 21 of the said Local Act (which works are set out hereunder) and for the provision of space for the erection of buildings adjoining or near to such street works (except as regards the premises in London Road which were formerly a Congregational Chapel);

The street works referred to above are:—

Street Work No. 7.—A new street together with a widening and improvement of Traffic Street commencing at the junction of London Road with Traffic Street and terminating at the junction of Siddals Road and the Morledge;

Street Work No. 8.—A widening and improvement of Burton Road on the south-east side thereof;

Street Work No. 9.—A widening of Burton Road on the north-west side thereof;

Street Work No. 10.—A widening and improvement of London Road and Osmaston Road at the junction of those two roads with St. Peter's Street.

(b) for the purposes mentioned in section 154 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and for the provision of space for the erection of buildings adjoining or near to Curzon Street and Abbey Street (being the lands which are numbered 775 on the plans and in the book of reference which were respectively deposited in connection with the Bill for the said Local Act).

(2) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875,

and in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given that H. A. de Montmorency, Esq., O.B.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Guildhall, Derby, on Monday, the eighteenth day of January, 1932, at half past eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

#### LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

##### SECTION 7.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Regulations from time to time made by him thereunder, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by the said Regulations upon the occasion of the season of Christmas, 1931, so that notwithstanding anything in the said Regulations the East Surrey Traction Company, Limited, may maintain on Thursday, the 24th day of December, 1931, upon any route in respect of which a Schedule has been deposited by them in accordance with Section 6 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, the service set out in any such Schedule for operation on Saturdays; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.
