FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS,  
1901 TO 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 31st December, 1931, he made Regulations under section 79 of the Act to apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which certain specified processes are carried on in connection with the manipulation of asbestos and the manufacture or repair of articles composed wholly or partly of asbestos and processes incidental thereto.

The Regulations, which are in accordance with the draft issued on the 15th September last, may be cited as the Asbestos Industry Regulations, 1931, and will come into force on the 1st March, 1932, except that the operation of certain of the Regulations is postponed.

employment on two day-shifts, of male young persons of 16 years of age and over in cotton weaving on automatic and semi-automatic looms at the Riverside Mills of Messrs. Jackson and Steeple (1919) Limited, Stalybridge; subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that additional daily hygrometer readings shall be taken and recorded.
