## WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1925.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department has appointed Thomas Crisp, Esq., M.D., Ch.B., of St. George's House, Chorley, to be Medical Referee under the above Act for the Districts of the Chorley; Lancaster; and Preston County Courts (Circuit No. 4).

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of eighteen years of age and over in attending circular hose knitting machines in the XL Department, No. 3 room, at the works of Messrs. Thomas Morley and Son, Great Central Street, Leicester, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make

such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in ironing, folding and boxing knitted hosiery underwear in the Finishing Department at the works of Messrs. William Baker (Leicester) Limited, The Newarkes Bridge, Leicester, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks, and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
