NOTE.—The following diseases were eradicated in Great Britain:—Cattle plague, or rinderpest (*pestis bovina*) in 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (*peripneumonia contagiosa bovum*) in 1898, sheep pox (*variola ovium*) in 1850; rabies in 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (*lymphangitis epizootica*) in 1908; and glanders (including farcy) (*malleus*) in 1928. Dourine has never existed in Great Britain.
