PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 E. 7. c. 29, 4-5 G. 5. c. 18, 9-10 G. 5. c. 80, and 18-19 G. 5. c. 3.), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on

the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Italy has acceded to the said Convention on behalf of the Italian Colonies of Libia and Eritrea and the Italian Dependencies in the Aegean Islands:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of the said Italian Colonies and Dependencies the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said Italian Colonies and Dependencies or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Libia, Eritrea and the Italian Aegean Islands confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the said Italian Colonies and Dependencies or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

- 2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Libia, Eritrea and the Italian Aegean Islands.
- 3. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Libia, Eritrea and Italian Aegean Islands) Order, 1932.

And whereas by virtue of section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1931, there has been substituted for the definition of "dealer" in subsection (3) of the said section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1920, the following definition:—

"The expression 'dealer' means a person who, being a member of a stock exchange in Great Britain, is recognised by the committee of that exchange as carrying on the business of a dealer."

And whereas under the terms of the said section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1931, the substitution aforesaid is subject to the proviso that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare that the Parliament of Northern Ireland have so amended the said section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1920, in its application to Northern Ireland as to extend the benefits thereof to all persons who are dealers within the meaning of the foregoing definition, that definition shall thereafter have effect as if for the words "Great Britain" there were substituted the words "the United Kingdom":

And whereas by virtue of section four of the Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1931, there has been substituted for the definition of "dealer" in subsection (3) of section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1920, in its application to Northern Ireland the following definition:—

"The expression 'dealer' means a person who, being a member of a stock exchange in the United Kingdom, is recognised by the committee of that exchange as carrying on the business of a dealer."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of the Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared:—

(1) That the Parliament of Northern Ireland have so amended the said section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1920, in its application to Northern Ireland as to extend the benefits thereof to all persons who are dealers within

the meaning of the definition contained in section forty-two of the Finance Act, 1931.

(2) That this Declaration may be cited as the "Transfers of Stock to Dealers (Stamp Duty) Declaration, 1932."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of November, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Corton Denham, situate in the County of Somerset, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Sandford Orcas, situate in the County of Dorset, and both in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Corton Denham and Sandford Orcas duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Corton Denham and Sandford Orcas are now full, the Reverend Frederick Barton Horspool being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Corton Denham and the Reverend Edward Taylor being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sandford Orcas:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Corton Denham and the said Benefice of Sandford Orcas shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Corton Denham with Sandford Orcas' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this

Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sandford Orcas shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Corton Denham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall in the first place be applied by us for or towards the extinction of any mortgage debt at the date of the union taking effect outstanding in respect of the cost of the provision of the Parsonage House at Corton Denham and any residue of the net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and if under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Corton Denham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, then the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Sandford Orcas, but otherwise such first turn shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Corton Denham.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wilby with the Chapelry of Brundish now annexed to the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tannington and together forming the Benefice of Tannington with Brundish (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bedingfield with the Chapelry of Southolt now annexed to the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Worlingworth and together forming the Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt and (3) of the said Benefice of Tannington with the said Benefice of Worlingworth all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Wilby with the said Chapelry of Brundish (2) of the said Benefice of Bedingfield with the said Chapelry of Southolt and (3) of the said Benefice of Worlingworth duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Wilby, Tannington with Brundish, Worlingworth with Southolt, and Bedingfield, are now full, the Reverend Henry Spelman Marriott being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wilby, the Reverend Sydney Charles Ward being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish, the Reverend George Thomas. Wilkes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt, and the Reverend Sydney Edward Caller being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bedingfield:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry Spelman Marriott and Sydney Edward Caller (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Wilby and the said Chapelry of Brundish being all that part of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Brundish shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish.'

"2. That the said Benefice of Bedingfield and the said Chapelry of Southolt being all that part of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Southolt shall be

permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bedingfield with Southolt.'

"3. That the said Benefice of Tannington and the said Benefice of Worlingworth shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Wilby shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Wilby shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the Parish of the same United Benefice.

"5. That the Church of the Parish of Bedingfield shall be the Parish Church of the Parish of the United Benefice of Bedingfield with Southolt and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Bedingfield shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the Parish of the same United Benefice.

"6. That (a) if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme both of the said Benefices of Tannington with Brundish and Worlingworth with Southolt shall be vacant the unions shall forthwith take effect and (b) if upon that day the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall be vacant but not the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish or if upon that day neither of such two Benefices shall be vacant and the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall be the first of such two Benefices to be vacated after that day then the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme shall take effect upon the day aforesaid or as the case may be upon such vacation of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt and the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 3 of this Scheme shall take effect upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish and in that case the Incumbent (if any) of the said Benefice of Worlingworth shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington and (c) if upon the day aforesaid the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall be vacant but not the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt or if upon that day neither of such two Benefices shall be vacant and the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall be the first of such two Benefices to be vacated after that day then the unions referred to in Clauses 1, 2 and 3 of this Scheme shall all take effect upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt and in that case the Incumbent (if any) of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington and in every case herein provided for the Incumbent (if any) of the said Benefice of Wilby shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish and the Incumbent (if any) of the said Benefice of Bedingfield shall become the first Incumbent of

the United Benefice of Bedingfield with Southolt.

"7. That upon the said unions taking effect respectively (a) the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Wilby (if any) shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington, (c) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bedingfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bedingfield with Southolt and (d) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish.

"8. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the several United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish after the unions the Patron of the said Benefice of Wilby shall have the first, the third and the fourth turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall have the second turn, (b) that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington to be made after the unions, the Patron of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall have the first, the third and the fourth turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall have the second turn, and (c) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to United Benefice of Bedingfield with Southolt after the unions, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bedingfield shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall have the second turn.

"9. That upon the unions taking effect respectively (a) the endowments of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Bedingfield with Southolt all glebe lands situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Southolt now belonging to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt together with all that Tithe Rent Charge commuted at £237 10s. 0d. now or formerly arising within the area of the Civil Parish of Southolt and payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with

Southolt and all capital sums of money, stocks, securities or other property being or representing the proceeds of any sale redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rent Charge and all other the endowments of the said Benefice of Worlingworth with Southolt shall belong to the Benefice of Worlingworth or as the case may be to the United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington and (b) the endowments of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Worlingworth with Tannington all that Tithe Rent Charge commuted at £83 10s. 0d. now or formerly arising within the area of the Civil Parish of Tannington and payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish and all capital sums of money, stocks, securities or other property being or representing the proceeds of any sale redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rent Charge and all other the endowments of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish shall belong to the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish.

"10. That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum received in any one year by way of net income from the endowments transferred from the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish to the United Benefice of Wilby with Brundish as recommended and proposed in Clause 9 of this Scheme, including the income arising in respect of the proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish referred to in Clause 7 of this Scheme.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

Ipswich:
