

Commissioners under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area for the supply of electrical energy by the Company so as to enable them to provide and distribute electrical energy for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 within that part of the parish of Ross Rural in the rural district of Ross which was transferred to the urban district of Ross by the County of Hereford (Ross Extension) Confirmation Order 1905 (hereinafter referred to as "the added area").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the added area all powers usually conferred upon distributors of electrical energy.

3. To authorise the Company to break up certain streets and parts of streets not repairable by the local authority within the added area.

4. To make provision as to the maximum prices which may be charged by the Company for electricity within their existing area of supply and within the added area.

And notice is hereby also given that any authority company body or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objections respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 21st day of March, 1932, and a copy of such objections must also be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitor or Parliamentary Agents.

LONDON LOCAL AUTHORITIES (SUPER-  
ANNUATION) TEMPORARY PRO-  
VISIONS.

THE London County Council have applied to Parliament for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") under the short title of "London Local Authorities (Superannuation) Temporary Provisions," the title of the Bill being "An Act to authorise the making of temporary modifications of enactments, schemes, regulations, orders and agreements relating to the payment of superannuation and other allowances by the London County Council and the councils of metropolitan boroughs; and for other purposes."

A notice containing a concise summary of the purposes of the Bill has been or will be published in full in the "Daily Telegraph" newspaper on the 17th and 24th days of February, 1932.
