The following Addresses were presented to His Majesty, at Buckingham Palace, on Friday the 19th instant:—

#### CONVOCATION OF CANTERBURY.

#### TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

We are conscious that the opportunity of addressing Your Majesty, on the opening of a new Convocation, comes to us at a time when difficulties and perplexities confront the whole world. On none must these manifold causes of anxiety press more heavily than on Your Majesty. We therefore welcome the chance, which our privilege affords us, of assuring Your Majesty alike of our respectful sympathy and of our whole-hearted appreciation of Your Majesty's unfailing zeal and practical concern for the good of all your subjects in these testing times.

We dare to believe that many of these present difficulties will yet prove to have been as goads pressing the peoples forward to a

new order of international fellowship. A world, already so manifestly interdependent economically, requires closer co-operation between Governments and greater readiness on the part of the peoples to act together for the good of all. Civilisation must move in this direction lest it perish. It is our fervent hope and prayer that the International Conferences about to assemble will carry us further on this road, and we are confident that Your Majesty's Government will exert itself to the uttermost therein to allay fears and suspicions, to remove their causes, to quicken mutual trust, and, for the sake both of peace and of honour, to secure the largest possible measure of general Disarmament.

But, so far as it can, each nation has also to work out for itself the restoration of its own prosperity, and happily signs are not wanting that, in the face of common dangers, Your Majesty's subjects in this country are being drawn together in mutual sympathy, in firm resolve, and in willing self-denial for the common good.

As always, and not least in these critical days, beyond readiness to adjust ourselves to the needs and demands of the hour, we need a faith which will give meaning and purpose to life, assurance that some of our highest hopes are meant to be realised because they

are in accord with the Will of God, and a motive which will constrain us constantly to live for their fulfilment. It must and will accordingly remain our primary task as Bishops and Clergy of the Church in England to declare to Your Majesty's subjects the reality, the power and the love of God; to discern and to interpret as best we may His beneficent purpose for mankind; and to seek ourselves to walk and to invite others to walk humbly in the august companionship of Our Saviour Christ. We are confident that Your Majesty shares our belief that this endeavour, to which we are committed is intensely relevant to the necessities of the present time; and Your Majesty has shown in various ways how constant and how high is your regard for the work of the Christian Ministry among the peoples of your Realm and Empire.

Finally, we are glad to be able to assure Your Majesty that the recent Lambeth Conference, whose members Your Majesty so graciously received, drew still closer the manifold ties which unite the Anglican Communion throughout the world; and that, at home and oversea, the movement towards Reunion among Christian people continues to gain strength and force. The goal of full Christian Reunion and the achievement of a true community of Nations are not unconnected. They may still be far distant. But it is much if, God helping us, we can feel that, however painfully, we move, in divers manners, towards them both.

We would conclude, as always, with the humble prayer that the blessing of Almighty God may continue to rest upon Your Majesty, upon our gracious Queen, and upon every member of the Royal House.

*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—*

It gives me much satisfaction to receive this loyal and dutiful Address from the Convocation of Canterbury, and to know that I have their sympathy and support in the tasks confronting me and my Ministers at the present time.

I share to the full the fervent hope and prayer of the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury for the success of the Disarmament Conference at Geneva. I am confident that my Governments throughout the British Commonwealth will exert themselves to the uttermost to secure the largest possible measure of general disarmament, and their endeavours will be greatly assisted by your whole-hearted support and by your prayers.

While every Nation, as you truly say, must work out its own restoration to prosperity, this duty need not conflict with obligations towards fellow members of the Community of Nations. The well-being of the world and the well-being of our own country depend on the same causes and are inseparable.

In this present crisis the Church has not only a great task but also a great opportunity. It is encouraging that the Bishops and Clergy fully realise this and are resolved to do their best to bring the eternal truths of Christianity to bear upon the practical problems and duties of a difficult time.

Eighteen months ago I had the pleasure of meeting the Members of the Lambeth Conference. I rejoice to know that their deliberations have been fruitful in promoting the unity of the Anglican Churches, and that the great cause of the Reunion of Christendom continues to progress. I believe, as you do, that the Reunion of Christian Peoples and the achievement of a true community of Nations derive their inspiration from a common source, and I share your hope and prayer that we may perform our part in the realisation of these high ideals.

May the Blessing of God rest upon the deliberations of the Convocation of Canterbury and upon all their labours for the well-being of the Church of Christ and of the people of my Realm.

#### CONVOCATION OF YORK.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's throne and person.

On the last occasion when it was our privilege thus to approach Your Majesty we recorded our gratitude that it had pleased Almighty God to restore Your Majesty to health and to the service of Your people after the long and grievous illness which had elicited from Your Majesty's subjects in all parts of the world an anxiety both deep and affectionate. We desire now to express our thankfulness that the vigour so restored has been so fully maintained as to enable Your Majesty to win in even greater measure the devotion and confidence of the British people by the wisdom of Your rule and example of self-sacrifice for the common good which Your Majesty has conspicuously given.

As we enter upon our deliberations and labours for the Church in a new Convocation we are deeply conscious of the anxieties which beset our country and all other countries. We pray that God will be pleased to guide with His Holy Spirit those who in our own and other nations are responsible for the formation of policy, so that by their efforts prosperity may be restored and peace with righteousness be more firmly established. Especially at this moment our prayers are offered on behalf of the Conference on Disarmament shortly to assemble in Geneva, that it may be enabled to increase among the nations of the world justice, security, confidence and good-will.

We inaugurated the new year with an act of national intercession in which men and women of all religious persuasions took part, and we await what it may bring with calm trust in Divine Providence. We are confident that the British people are determined so to fulfil with steadfast courage their difficult duty that they and their fellow-subjects in every part of Your Majesty's dominions may be united in loyalty and good-will, and to do or

suffer with patience and constancy what is required of them that the blessings of peace and prosperity may be secured to all nations.

And we shall ever pray that the blessing of Almighty God may rest abundantly upon Your Majesty's person, family and realm.

*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—*

I sincerely thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the blessing which you invoke on me and my family. Your references to the restoration of my health and sympathetic appreciation of the work which I have been permitted to do for my People have deeply touched me.

I share to the full the fervent hope and prayer of the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York for the success of the Disarmament Conference at Geneva. I am confident that my Governments throughout the British Commonwealth will exert themselves to the uttermost to secure the largest possible measure of general disarmament and their endeavours will be greatly assisted by your wholehearted support and by your prayers.

The fortitude of the British People in the face of their present difficulties has shown the world that the spirit of unity and mutual service, which shone so brightly during the miseries of war, still lives in their hearts, ready to be rekindled in time of national emergency. I pray that Divine Guidance may be with those who, in these anxious days, bear the great responsibility of directing the affairs of our own and other Nations.

May the Blessing of God be with the Convocation of York in their deliberations and in all their work for the well-being of the Church.

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 4th March, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 7th March, 1932, to Saturday, the 12th March, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

#### MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

##### REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders-in-Council to require imported goods of certain

classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- (1) Wire netting and woven wire, including chain link fencing.
- (2) Iron and steel wire, and wire nails and staples, of the following descriptions:
  - (a) Barbed wire on reels;
  - (b) Wire nails and wire staples;
  - (c) Wire in coils or bundles, including strand wire;
  - (d) Baling wire cut and looped at one end or both.

Attention is called to the fact that the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Order, 1927, requires imported goods of these descriptions to bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, except exposure for sale wholesale by a person being a wholesale dealer, and the Committee have been asked to report upon the question whether such goods should be required to bear an indication of origin on importation or on exposure for sale wholesale by a person being a wholesale dealer.

#### MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

##### REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

1. Iron and steel wire rods in coil.
2. Umbrella ribs, tubes and frames of iron and steel wire.
3. The following descriptions of reinforcement materials:—
  - (a) Fabricated meshwork or lattice made from iron and steel wire;
  - (b) Helicals, spirals, stirrups and hoops of iron and steel.

The reference made to the Committee on the 14th May, 1929, in respect of imported lattice reinforcements and stirrups of iron and steel for concrete construction, which was published in the Gazette of the 17th May, 1929, is hereby annulled.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF WRITING ASSISTANT (FEMALE) IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.**

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age are 16 and 17. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of the year, the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year, the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted. Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not

fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates must be unmarried and will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

B. In the case of all other male workers:—

(ii) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and worker.

(iii) All employment in excess of 42½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Good Friday falls.

(iv) All employment in excess of 39 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(v) All employment in excess of 52 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in summer.

(vi) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

C. In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment on Sunday, Good Friday and Christmas Day.

(ii) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any other day.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first day of February and terminating on the last day of October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.

To empower the Corporation upon the undermentioned lands to erect, maintain, alter, improve and renew gasworks with all necessary machinery and apparatus and do all such acts as may be proper for making and storing gas and for supplying gas within the limits of supply and also upon the said lands to work up and convert the residual products arising directly or indirectly from the manufacture of gas by the Corporation or purchased by them and for this purpose to empower the Corporation to purchase from any source and use such material as is required to work up and convert any such residual product. #### DERBY CORPORATION (TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT).

##### ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS by Section 22 of the Derby Corporation Act, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1930") the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Derby (therein and hereafter referred to as "the Corporation") were authorised to provide maintain and equip trolley vehicles and to use the same on authorised tramway routes in the borough and on other routes therein mentioned.

And whereas it is enacted in Section 34 of the Act of 1930 *inter alia* as follows:—

"(1) At any time after the passing of this Act the Minister of Transport may by order authorise or require the Corporation to abandon or discontinue temporarily or permanently any of the tramways of the Corporation along the route of which the Corporation have provided and equipped or are about to provide and equip trolley vehicles under the provisions of this Act or any Provisional Order made thereunder.

"(3) Any order made under the provisions of this section may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cessation of all or any of the powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any tramway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such Order and for the portion of the road upon which the tram-

way is situate to be left in good repair and condition so as to comply with the requirements of section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870."

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 22, the Corporation are about to provide and equip trolley vehicles along the route of the tramways hereinafter described authorised by the Derby Corporation Act, 1901; that is to say:—

*Tramway No. 22 (part of)* commencing in Babington Lane at a point about 0.65 chain north-east of Malthouse Lane passing thence into and along Burton Road and terminating at a point in that road about 6 chains south-west of Farley Road.

*Tramway No. 23 (part of)* commencing in the Wardwick at a point about 0.73 chain south-east of Curzon Street, passing thence into and along Curzon Street, Uttoxeter New Road and Uttoxeter Road and terminating in Uttoxeter Road at its junction with Manor Road.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") for an order to authorise the permanent discontinuance and abandonment by them of the tramways hereinbefore described.

Now therefore the Minister, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 34 of the Act of 1930 and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling, hereby orders as follows:—

(1) The Corporation may and shall forthwith abandon or discontinue the tramways hereinbefore described.

(2) As from the date of this order all the powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or order relating to the said tramways shall cease.

(3) The portion of the road upon which the tramways are situate shall be left in good repair and condition so as to comply with the requirements of Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

(4) This order may be cited as "The Derby Corporation (Tramways Abandonment) Order, 1932."
