WANDLE VALLEY JOINT SEWERAGE DISTRICT.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1875.

To the Wandle Valley Joint Sewerage Board;
To the Urban District Council of Beddington
and Wallington;

To the Urban District Council of Mitcham; To the Urban District Council of Merton and Morden; and

To all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by virtue of the Wandle Valley Joint Sewerage Orders, 1916 and 1927 (which were duly confirmed by Parliament), the Urban Districts of Beddington and Wallington, Mitcham, and Merton and Morden constitute a United District for the purposes of the provision and maintenance of a main sewer or sewers and the disposal of the sewage of the United District and the governing body of the said district is the Wandle Valley Joint Sewerage Board:

And whereas application has been made to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order to amend the above mentioned Order of 1916 by increasing the representation of the Urban District Council of Merton and Morden on the Joint Sewerage Board by one elective member:

WARRINGTON CORPORATION LIGHT RAILWAYS (CESSER OF POWERS) ORDER, 1932.
