The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 1st day of March, 1932, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 1ST MARCH, 1932.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide that votes at elections held by the Congregation of the University may be given otherwise than at a meeting of the Congregation, NOW THE UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In *Statut. Tit. X. Sect. II. § 4. cl. 4 (c)* (*Statuta*, ed. 1931, p. 251, l. 16) after the word "candidates" in the first place where it occurs the words "for election in Convocation" shall be inserted.

2. *Id. ib.* (l. 19) the words "or Congregation" shall be struck out.

3. *Id. ib.* (l. 26) the words "or Congregation, as the case may be" shall be struck out and the following substituted:—"If at the close of the time prescribed for the nomination of candidates for election in Congregation so many candidates only have been nominated, or being nominated have not withdrawn, as to leave no more than are sufficient to fill the vacancies, the candidates so nominated shall be deemed to be duly elected from the date appointed for the election; and the election shall be published in the usual manner, and shall also be announced by the Vice-Chancellor at the next ensuing meeting of Congregation."

4. *Id. (e)* (l. 33) after the word "election" the words "in Convocation" shall be inserted, and the words "whether in Convocation or in Congregation" shall be struck out.

5. *Id.* (l. 37) after sub-clause (e) the following new sub-clause shall be inserted and the subsequent sub-clause re-lettered "(g)":—

"(f) If at the time of election in Congregation there shall be a number of candidates nominated greater than the number of vacancies, the procedure of the election shall be as follows:—

(1) The Registrar shall dispatch to every member of Congregation at his last known place of residence, or at such other place as the member shall in writing direct, not later than the fourth day before the day fixed by

the Vice-Chancellor for the election, a voting-paper on which shall be specified the latest time by which it must be delivered at the Registrar's Office.

(2) The form of the voting-paper, and the method of recording votes, shall be prescribed by the Vice-Chancellor.

(3) The voting-paper, after being signed by the voter and a witness, shall be delivered at the Registrar's Office by post prepaid or by hand.

(4) An election shall not be deemed to be invalid owing to misdirection or non-receipt of any voting-paper.

(5) The Registrar shall be responsible for the counting of the votes, but the Vice-Chancellor and Proctors shall decide on the validity of any vote which, in the opinion of the Registrar, is in doubt.

(6) The senior in University standing of any candidates for whom an equal number of votes have been given shall be deemed to be duly elected.

(7) The result of the election shall be published in the usual manner, and shall also be announced by the Vice-Chancellor at the next ensuing meeting of Congregation."
