And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 18th day of February, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Saints, situate at Stechford, in the Parish of Yardley, in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, situate at Stechford as aforesaid:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Yardley which is described in the Schedule

hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of All Saints, situate at Stechford as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of All Saints, Stechford.’

“And with the like consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of All Saints, situate at Stechford as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of All Saints, Stechford, being:—

“All that part of the Parish of Yardley, in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the North by the New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Margaret, Castle Bromwich, upon the West partly by the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Ward End, and partly by the district of Saint Paul, Bordesley Green, all in the County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the South and upon the East by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of New Bridge which carries Yardley Green Road across the River Cole where the boundaries of the said District of Saint Paul, Bordesley Green, of the New Parish of Saint Benedict, Bordesley, in the said County of Warwick and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and of the said Parish of Yardley, all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Yardley Green Road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Richmond Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Richmond Road for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yardley Fields Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Yardley Fields Road for a distance of 45½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Church Road for a distance of 49½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the proposed new road to be called Glebe Farm Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of the course of such proposed road for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Yardley from the said New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Margaret, Castle Bromwich.”
