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Milan, March 26. N. S.

THE two Regiments of *Wirttemberg* that quartered in this Duchy came yesterday to *Como* in order to be there Reviewed, being paid off, to be sent back to *Germany*. For the Differences between the Dukes of *Spain* and *Monaco*, are not yet Adjusted, but that Subjects will in all appearance break out new Hostilities. Cardinal *Grimani* having had here some time for the coming of the Duke of *Vaudemont*, is gone for *Rome*, intending to return hither upon the first notice of that Duke's arrival, who is shortly expected.

Milan, March 29. The Earl of *Manchester*, Ambassador Extraordinary from the King of *Great-Britain* had on the 22th instant his Audience of Leave from the Senate, and intends in 8 or 10 days to part for *England*. A Convoy, with some Forces, of a considerable quantity of Provisions and Ammunition sailed hence last Tuesday for the Levant. *Don Sebastian* is going to *Moscow* with the Character of Resident from this Republick.

Danzick, April 2. The King of *Poland* intends on the 6th or 7th instant to set out for *Warsaw*, which he now said, he will take his way by *Gratz* and *Thorne*, and not by *Elbing* as was at first signed. A Treaty is on foot for taking 6000 Men of the Forces of *Saxe Gotha* into the Service of his Crown. It is much discoursed, that besides the Promises made lately on the part of the King of *Sweden*, to assist us against a Foreign Invasion, the Assurances have likewise been given to the City by the King of *Denmark*, and the Elector of *Brandenburg*. Our Letters from *Lithuania* bring us an Account, That the Disorders in that Duchy are as great as ever, and that General *Sapieha* was marching with some Troops and Cannon against the great Ensign *Ogimsky*.

Vinnia, March 29. The Emperor's Ministers are daily Consulting of the Means to raise the necessary Supplies for encreasing and maintaining our Forces in *Hungary* next Summer; and Four Millions of Livres having lately been demanded of the States of that Kingdom, of which two are already paid, Cardinal *Collenitz* went thither some days ago, to sollicite the speedy Payment of the remainder. It has been thought fit to make a considerable addition to our Strength on the *Danube*, and Orders are given to hasten the firing off of the Six Gallies which are building to that effect, and are in such a forwardness, that one is already Launched which carries 16 great Guns in the lower Tire, and as many small ones and Patroeroes on the Deck and Fore-Castle, so that 'tis hoped they will all joyn our Fleet by the middle of *May*. A great number of Horses passed lately by this place going for *Hungary* to remount the Cavalry. We hear from the Frontiers, That a *Bassa* is come to *Jassy* in *Moldavia*, with a Sum of Money designed for Supplying the Garison of *Cornicic*.

Francfort, April 6. The Meeting of the Circles of the *Upper Rhine* which has been held here for

some days is now drawing near a Conclusion. We hear, The Circle of *Franconia* is to assemble as this day, being to consider of several Points relating to the Supplies demanded of them by the Emperor. Our Advices from *Strasbourg* say, That notwithstanding the Assurances given by the French Court to the Protestants in that City, that no Alteration shall be made there in Matters of Religion, several of them were preparing to remove thence with their Families. The Elector *Palatine* has ordered a Placet to be published, Commanding all his Subjects to come and take Possession of their Estates within a certain time, on Default of which, they are to Forfeit them.

Hambourg, April 8. Mr. *Cresse*, His Majesty of *Great Britain's* Envoy Extraordinary, set out hence yesterday for the Courts of *Hanover* and *Zell*. This morning the Duke of *Holstein* began his Journey to *Stockholme*, where he is going to Marry the Princess Royal of *Sweden*; and the Prince and Princess of *Wolfenbuttel*, who were come hither to take their Leaves of that Duke, returned the same day to their usual Residence at *Wolfenbuttel*. The Sieur *Buschol* is lately arrived here as Commissary from the Elector of *Brandenburg*. Our last Letters from *Stockholme* say, The King of *Sweden* designed to be Crowned at *Upsal* on the 13th instant, and would afterwards begin his intended Visit of the several Provinces of his Kingdom. And that Baron *Van Heeckeren*, who has Resided at that Court on the part of the *States General*, had taken his Leave, and was on his departure for *Holland*.

Paris, April 10. The Earl of *Portland* His Majesty of *Great Britain's* Ambassador Extraordinary, went on the 4th instant to *Notre Dame de Liesse*, to meet the Prince of *Vaudemont*, who passed that way in his Journey to *Milan*, of which Duchy the King of *Spain* has made him Governor. This day his Excellency Entertained the Prince of *Conzi* and several Persons of Quality at Dinner. Lieutenant-General *Vauban* left this place yesterday, being to Visit *Mexieres*, *Charleville*, *Sedan*, and the other Frontier Places on the *Meuse*; after which, he will in his return view the Fortifications of those along the Sea Coast, and give Orders for their being repaired and strengthened. The Court is expected at *Versailles* next Saturday from *Marly*. Monsieur *d'Aragnan* is returned hither from *Flanders*, the further Disbanding of the French Forces on that Frontier being put off for some time. We hear some Troops are marching towards *Mont-Dauphin* in *Dauphine*, to work on the Fortifications intended to be made there, and that others are Commanded for the Province of *Guyenne*. The Marquis *de Villars* is appointed to go Envoy Extraordinary to the Emperor. Baron *Shomborne*, late Ambassador from the Elector of *Mentz* at the Treaty of Peace, who came here some time since, has received Orders from that Elector, to take upon him the Character of his Envoy Extraordinary to this Court. We hear from *Strasbourg*, That a difficulty is arisen touching the Demolishing of the Bridge at *Brisac*, the Marquis *d'Uxelles* having ordered the whole Bridge to be Ruinated; whereas the German Officers insist, that that part
