WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of February, 1932 (CW/L/49/32), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, and by subsequent Orders in Council, to sanction the establishment of a Royal Marine Police Force, and rates of pay and conditions of service therein:

“And whereas we are of opinion that it has now become necessary to appoint an

Officer in charge of the Royal Marine Police Force and for duties connected therewith:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction the appointment of a Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, accordingly, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1932, under the conditions set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

“SCHEDULE.

“1. The non-pensionable appointment of Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, to be established from the 1st January, 1932, and to be filled by a Lieutenant-Colonel or Major, Royal Marines, on the Retired List.

“2. The appointment to be held during the pleasure of the Admiralty, and to be vacated on the holder reaching the age of 60.

“3. The salary of the post to be £1,000 a year, such rate to be regarded as a standard rate and to be subject to variation in relation to the cost of living in the same manner and on the same occasions as the full pay etc. of Officers generally. An official residence to be provided, or an allowance in lieu at the rate laid down for Lodging Allowance in King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

“4. Retired pay to be suspended during tenure of the appointment.

" 5. A gratuity to be payable on vacating the appointment at the rate of £8 for each complete calendar month's service, subject to a maximum of £1,440. The rate of gratuity and the maximum thereof to be standard rates liable to variation as set forth in paragraph 3, and to be subject to the rules and conditions laid down in respect of the corresponding gratuities payable to Chief Inspectors, Royal Marine Police.

" 6. In the event of death or disability directly attributable to the conditions of service, additional compensation may be paid at our discretion to the Officer or to his dependent relatives according to the Regulations in force for corresponding ranks of the Royal Marines.

" 7. When the Officer is subsisted in hospital, a deduction to be made from pay equivalent to the daily rate of Provision Allowance in force at the time."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom herein-after mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and

with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

TASMANIA.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, it is provided that neither the general ad valorem duty nor any additional duty imposed under that Act shall be chargeable in respect of goods which are shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs to have been consigned from, and grown, produced or manufactured in (a) any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom other than a country to which Section 4 of the said Act applies, or (b) any territory which is under His Majesty's protection and that His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said Section 5 shall apply to any territory in respect of which a Mandate of the League of Nations is being exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom as if that territory were a territory under His Majesty's protection:

And whereas Mandates of the League of Nations have been conferred upon His Majesty and are being exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom in respect of the undermentioned territories, that is to say:—

- (a) the Tanganyika Territory;
- (b) the Cameroons under British Mandate;
- (c) Togoland under British Mandate.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows:—

(1) Section 5 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, shall apply to the above-mentioned Territories as if those Territories were Territories under His Majesty's protection;

(2) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Mandated Territories) Preference Order, 1932.

Berne Copyright Convention of 1908 (Treaty Series No. 19 of 1912), was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912 (S.R. & O. 1912, No. 913) (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention:

And whereas at Rome on the 2nd day of June, 1928, His Majesty and the Heads of certain Foreign States, having resolved to revise and complete the said Convention, agreed upon a Convention (Miscellaneous No. 11 (1931) (Cmd. 3864)) (hereinafter called the Rome Convention) for the purpose of replacing the said Convention of 1908:

And whereas the said Rome Convention was duly ratified by His Majesty on behalf of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of British India, and notice has been given of the application of the said Rome Convention to all other parts of His Majesty's dominions, including any territories under His Majesty's protection, to which the Principal Order applies:

And whereas Japan has given notice of the application of the said Rome Convention to Korea, Formosa, Japanese Saghalien and Kwantung Leased Territory subject to the reservation mentioned in the Schedule to this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall extend to Korea, Formosa, Japanese Saghalien and Kwantung Leased Territory as if those territories were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (a) and Article 2, proviso (iii) (c) shall apply as if Korea, Formosa, Japanese Saghalien and Kwantung Leased Territory were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Korea, Formosa, Japanese Saghalien or Kwantung Leased Territory the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs and the 1st day of August, 1931, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Subsection 1 (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Subsection 1 (b).

2. This Order shall not apply to that part of the Mandated Territory of Palestine which is known as Trans-Jordan.

3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright Convention (Japanese Territories) Order, 1932.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Chipstead, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Chipstead is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Honourable Hylton George Hylton, Baron Hylton:

“And whereas the said Hylton George Hylton, Baron Hylton, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Chipstead, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being:

“And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness he the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canter-

bury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, has also executed this Scheme in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary:

“And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Chipstead which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Chipstead:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Hylton George Hylton, Baron Hylton (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Chipstead, now vested in him, the said Hylton George Hylton, Baron Hylton, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and by his successors in the same Archbishopric for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measure relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by his Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ganarew and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Whitchurch, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ganarew and Whitchurch duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said two Benefices are now full, the Reverend William Owen Jones being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ganarew and the Reverend Daniel Octavius Thomas being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Whitchurch:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Ganarew and the said Benefice of Whitchurch shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Whitchurch with Ganarew ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Whitchurch shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Whitchurch shall have the first and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Ganarew shall have the second turn.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.
