## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th April, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday, the 11th April, 1932, to Saturday, the 16th April, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Secretary of State has made an Order dated 23rd March, 1932, under Section 7 of the Reorganisation of Offices (Scotland) Act, 1928, providing for the discontinuance as from 1st April, 1932, of the office of Director of Chancery.

The Order, which has been made after consultation with the Lord President of the Court of Session, directs that the powers and duties of the Director with respect to bonds of caution for tutors of law, curators, and tutors-dative, and the issue of letters of tutory or curatory

under the Judicial Factors Act, 1849, and to the procedure for the cognition of the insane under the Court of Session Act, 1868, shall be exercised and performed by the Principal Extractor of the Court of Session; and that all the other powers and duties of the Director shall be exercised and performed by the Keeper of the Registers and Records of Scotland.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 30TH MARCH, 1932.)

IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1932.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Restrictions on Use of Landing Places for  
Imported Animals.*

1. Article 6 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, and Article 5 of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923 shall be read and have effect as if the following words were inserted at the end thereof, namely:—

“ The Landing Place, or any part thereof, shall not be used for any purpose other than the purposes authorised in respect of such Landing Places by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, or any Order of the

Minister under those Acts in relation thereto.”

*Disposal of Fodder, Litter and Dung, brought to Great Britain with Animals from Ireland, Channel Islands or Isle of Man.*

2.—(1) Dung of animals brought from Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, and partly consumed or broken fodder that has been supplied to such animals, and litter that has been used for or about such animals shall not be landed at any place without the previous consent in writing of the Local Authority of the District in which the place is situate, and shall if and when landed, be forthwith well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with animals or shall be effectually destroyed by fire. Such consent shall not be given unless and until a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries has certified that the said animals are free from disease.

(2) All other fodder and litter carried in the same vessel with animals brought to Great Britain from Ireland, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, may be landed without the previous consent of the Local Authority, but shall, when landed, remain under the charge of an Officer of Customs and Excise, and such fodder and litter shall not be removed from the place of landing except with the permission in writing of an Officer of Customs and Excise, which permission shall not be given unless and until a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries has certified that the said animals are free from disease.

(3) This Article shall be read with and as part of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923.

*Amendment of—*

(a) *Schedule to Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2);*

(b) *Part IV of Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923; and*

(c) *Part V of Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923.*

3.—(1) In paragraph Three of Regulation Two of the Schedule to the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), and in paragraph (3) of Article 29 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, and in paragraph (3) of Article 36 of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923, for the words:—

“ otherwise than under a licence granted by a local inspector and in accordance with such conditions, if any, as may be imposed by the licence or otherwise than ”

there shall be substituted the following words, namely:—

“ except with the authority and in accordance with the provisions of a licence granted by a local inspector for movement ”.

(2) In the second paragraph of Regulation Three of the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2) and in the second paragraph of Article 30 of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923 and in the second paragraph of

Article 37 of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923, for the words:—

“ otherwise than under a further licence to be granted by a local inspector or otherwise than ”

there shall be substituted the following words, namely:—

“ except with the authority and in accordance with the provisions of a licence granted by a local inspector for movement ”.

(3) Imported cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall cease to be deemed imported animals for the purposes of the provisions of the Schedule to the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2) or of the provisions of Part IV of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, or of the provisions of Part V of the Importation of Canadian Cattle Order of 1923, after the expiration of the prescribed period of six days detention in the case of cattle, sheep or goats and after the expiration of the prescribed period of twenty-seven days detention in the case of swine.

(4) A Local Authority may, for the purpose of the better execution and enforcement of the provisions of the said Schedule and of the aforesaid Orders insert such conditions as it thinks fit in any authority granted by it for the use of a market as a specially authorised market for the purposes of the said provisions, or for the use of lairs or enclosures for the temporary detention of imported cattle, sheep or goats while awaiting exposure for sale in a specially authorised market. The Local Authority may require the owner or person in charge of animals exposed at a specially authorised market or the person exposing the same, to inform an officer of the Local Authority or the police, at the close of the day, of the names and addresses, if known, of the persons to whom he has sold animals and of the numbers of each class sold to each person, and may require the person who applies for a licence authorising the movement of animals from the market to state the name and address, if known, of the person from whom he purchased the animals.

(5) Without prejudice to any power of revocation of the Minister, a Local Authority may revoke any licence or authorisation granted or

issued by it under the aforesaid Schedule and Orders.

*Commencement.*

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-two.

*Short Title.*

5. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTED ANIMALS ORDER OF 1932.
