"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Merton, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south by the Parish of Morden, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west and upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, from the said Parish of Merton at a point in Whatley Avenue opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Cannonhill Common, and extending thence south eastward to and along such footpath for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north western boundary of Cannonhill Common and extending thence first south westward to and along such boundary and then south eastward along the south western boundary of the said common for a distance in all of $45\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the southern corner of such common on the north western side of Cannon Hill Lane, and extending thence first south eastward to and then south westward along the middle of Cannon Hill Lane for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Merton from the said Parish of Morden.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, and to be annexed to the District of Saint James, Malden, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, which is bounded upon the south west partly by the Parish of Malden, in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the said District of Saint James, Malden, upon the north west by the last named District, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north east and upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint James, Malden, from the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, at the junction of the Kingston Bypass Road with Consfield Avenue, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Consfield Avenue for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Claremont Avenue, and extending thence south eastward in a straight line at right angles to Claremont Avenue for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Wimbledon and Epsom Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish

of Saint Saviour, Raynes Park, from the said Parish of Malden."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.
