

the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 14th day of April, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and the New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 3rd day of February, 1866, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Michael, Wood Green, situate in the Parish of Tottenham, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, and such District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Wood Green ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 16th day of December, 1912, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, situate within the New Parish of Christ Church, West Green, Tottenham, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham ’:

“ And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and of the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the

date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, and of the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, shall be altered so that all those portions of the said Parish of Tottenham and of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham.

“ And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Tottenham, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Benet Fink, Tottenham, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Michael, Wood Green, upon part of the north by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Chitts Hill, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Chitts Hill, from the said Parish of Tottenham at the junction of White Hart Lane with Rivulet Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Rivulet Road for a distance of 30½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Jellicoe Road and Great Cambridge Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Great Cambridge Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Roundway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Roundway for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Henningham Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Henningham Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with De Quincey Road, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of De Quincey Road for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Risley Avenue opposite to the northern entrance to Tower Gardens, and extending thence southward in a straight line across Tower Gardens for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises
