DECREE SUPPLEMENTING THE LAW OF THE 25TH JANUARY, 1929, RESPECTING THE INTERNAL PUBLIC DEBT.

Signed on the 21st January, 1932, and published on the 30th January, 1932.

The Congress of the United Mexican States decrees:

ARTICLE 1.

Base II of Article 1 of the Law of the 25th January, 1929, is supplemented by the following paragraphs:

(M) Mortgage liabilities (créditos hipotecarios) guaranteed by real estate, the property of the Federation. The payment of these liabilities shall be made provided that the creditors agree to their liquidation in the course of two years, as from 1932, and in addition, forgo the payment of interest due but not paid as from the 1st January, 1929, and also interest falling due in the future until the final liquidation of the liabilities.

(N) Liabilities of less than \$100.00 pesos of whatever nature.

(Ñ) Liabilities in respect of contributions collected in conformity with the Decree of the 21st September, 1927, for the constitution of the capital of the Single Bank (Banco Unico).

ARTICLE 2.

The ending of the state of suspension of payment in regard to the liabilities mentioned in these supplementary paragraphs and in those contained in the Law of the 10th January, 1930, does not imply, in respect of these liabilities, the waiving of the obligation that they must, in the first instance, be approved by the Adjusting Commission and in consequence of the obligation to have had recourse to this Commission in proper time and form; therefore, payments to be made in conformity with the laws set forth shall invariably be based on awards of that Commission without any further revision by any other authority being necessary.

There are excepted from the provisions of the preceding paragraph liabilities which may be considered as admitted (depuradas) under the provisions of Fraction XII of Article 2 of the regulating law of the 20th of February, 1929.

The KING was pleased on Thursday, the 5th instant, at Buckingham Palace, to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Mr. Justice (Geoffrey) Lawrence.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the Edward Medal to the late John Birks, in recognition of his gallantry in endeavouring to save life at the cost of his own life in the following circumstances:—

On the 7th January, 1932, at 6.45 a.m., Birks and another washerman, Harry Perkins, were

changing their shoes in a messroom on the premises of the Co-operative Laundries Association, Manchester. The messroom was formed by two partitions in a corner of the Boiler Room, and the floor was three feet below the general floor level. Suddenly a large water tank above the messroom burst and volumes of scalding water cascaded through a skylight into the messroom between the two men from the only door through which they could have escaped. The lights went out, and the room was dark and full of steam. Birks immediately placed himself between Perkins and the cascade of scalding water, and helped Perkins on to a table, whence he was helped over the partition by other men outside. Birks who was probably unable to reach the top of the partition unaided, finally escaped from the messroom through the door. Both men unfortunately died as a result of the scalds which they sustained.

Perkins was only 18 years of age, and there can be no doubt that Birks, who was only 6 years older, deliberately gave up his own chance of escape in attempting to save Perkins.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS, 1877 TO 1927.

IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES ORDER OF 1932.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927. The effect of the Order is to prohibit the landing in England or Wales after the 27th May of French cherries except those accompanied by certificates issued by the French Phytopathological Service to the effect that the cherries were grown within a small district in the north of France. This area is defined in a Schedule to the Order.

After the 5th June the landing in England or Wales of Italian cherries is prohibited except those grown in the Region of Emilia. After the 10th June the importation of cherries grown in any part of Italy is entirely prohibited. Consignments imported between the 6th and 10th June must be accompanied by certificates issued by the Italian Phytopathological Service.

German cherries imported after the 27th May must be accompanied by certificates of origin; after the 26th June the importation of German cherries is prohibited except of those accompanied by certificates issued by the German Phytopathological Service to the effect that the cherries were not grown south of latitude 53° N. or in East Prussia.

Cherries grown in other European countries and imported after the 27th May must be accompanied by certificates of origin.

The certificates prescribed in the Order must be delivered to the Officer of Customs and Excise with the entry relating to the consignment.

Cherries landed without the certificates prescribed in the Order must be destroyed at the expense of the importer unless they are re-exported or are disposed of in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry.

An Inspector may enter any premises and open, examine and take samples of any cherries shipped or believed to have been shipped from any European country; any person wilfully obstructing or impeding an Inspector in the exercise of these powers, or failing to comply with the provisions relating to destruction or re-exportation, or with the terms of a licence, is liable to a penalty of £10, or in respect of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of £50.
