The KING has been graciously pleased to appoint the Reverend Harold Costley-White, D.D., Headmaster of Westminster School, to be one of the Chaplains to His Majesty in the room of the Reverend Bertram Fitzgerald Simpson, M.C., M.A., resigned.

Whitehall, May 14, 1932.

The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Daniel Hanbury, Esq., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of an Officer of the Order of the Crown of Italy, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of Italy in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the reeling of box yarn in the Reeling Department at the Aber Works of Messrs. Courtaulds Limited, Flint, North Wales, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not 65-33826

be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; that additional daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance, or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

Metropolitan Electric Cable and Construction Company Limited, Chadwell Heath, Essex, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
