EDUCATIONAL ENDOWMENTS (SCOT-LAND) ACTS, 1928 AND 1931.

Notice is hereby given that a Scheme framed by the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Commissioners and entitled "The Edinburgh University (Fellowships, Scholarships and Bursaries) Scheme, 1931," has been approved by the Scottish Universities Committee of the Privy Council. Notice is hereby further given that unless within two months of the date hereof a petition is presented as provided in the above Acts the said Scheme will be submitted for approval by His Majesty in Council.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th May, 1932, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th May, 1932, to Saturday, the 65-33827

4th June, 1932, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief

Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
