The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, in the University of Oxford, on the 24th day of May, 1932, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

ALL SOULS COLLEGE, OXFORD.

AMENDMENT TO STATUTES.

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, did, by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 4th day of February, 1925, approve certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners who are therein described as "The College of the Souls of All Faithful People deceased in the University of Oxford":

And whereas such Statutes were approved by His Majesty King George the Fifth in Council, on the 25th day of June, 1925:

And whereas at a Special General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held

on the 14th day of March, 1932, it was unanimously resolved, by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the alterations in and additions to the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made (that is to say):—

That in Statute II (The Warden) there shall be added at the end of clause 6 (Emoluments of the Warden) the words following (that is to say):—

"The Warden shall receive in addition, as an allowance to meet the expenses of entertainment and all other expenses of whatever nature incurred by him by reason of his tenure of his office, such a sum, not exceeding £500, as he shall certify in writing to have been required for these purposes".

That in Statute III (The Fellows) clause 11 (Official Fellowships) which was numbered as clause 12 in the Statutes made by the Commissioners for the College, the words "Public Reader in the University" shall be repealed and the words "University Reader" shall be substituted therefor, and the words following, that is to say, "and for the purposes of this sub-clause the expression 'University Reader' shall mean any person who holds in the University any Readership which is established or specially regulated by any Statute or Decree of the University" shall be inserted after the words "shall at no time exceed two".

That in Statute III (The Fellows) clause 17 (Power to elect University Readers to Fellowships) which was numbered as clause 18 in the Statutes made by the Commissioners for the College, shall be repealed and there shall be substituted therefor a new clause 17, to be in the words and figures following, namely:—

“The Warden and Fellows may, if they think fit, elect to a Fellowship tenable during his tenure of office, but without emolument, any Professor or University Reader, or any of the University Officers enumerated in the Schedule annexed to Titulus XXVI of the Statutes of the University (Of University Officers whose offices qualify them to hold Professorial Fellowships) or any other University Officer whom the University may from time to time add to those Officers by Statute or Decree.

“For the purposes of this clause, the expression ‘University Reader’ shall mean any person who holds in the University any Readership, which is established or specially regulated by any Statute or Decree of the University.”

Now, we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King’s Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty’s Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths’ Hall, in the City of London, on the 1st March and concluded on the 4th May, 1932, the following Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King’s Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, before the King’s Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths’ Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty’s silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one to the 31st day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number

corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins, with four additional coins from one of such packets making altogether two crowns, forty-five half-crowns, twenty-six florins, twenty shillings, forty-one sixpences, one fourpence, twenty-three threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising two crowns, six half-crowns, twelve florins, eleven shillings, ten sixpences, one fourpence, one threepence, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920 was, for such pound so taken for assay plus four thousandths (+.004) of an ounce on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighted and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was nil on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being two hundred and twenty-three thousandths of an ounce (+.223) above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE MELBOURNE BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, before the King’s Remembrancer, at Gold-

smiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to five sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was nil on the whole of such coins. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being neither above nor below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took the said five sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123·328 grains, the second 123·187 grains, the third 123·330 grains, the fourth 123·299 grains, the fifth 123·231 grains and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first sixty-four thousandths of a grain above (+·064), the second eighty-seven thousandths of a grain below (-·087), the third fifty-six thousandths of a grain above (+·056), the fourth twenty-five thousandths of a grain above (+·025), the fifth forty-three thousandths of a grain below (-·043), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

We then assayed the said five sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·76, the second 916·61, the third 916·73, the fourth 916·59, the fifth 916·64, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively—the first ten hundred-thousandths above (+·00010), the second five hundred-thousandths below (-·00005), the third seven hundred-thousandths above (+·00007), the fourth seven hundred-thousandths below (-·00007), the fifth two hundred-thousandths below (-·00002), the standard fineness prescribed as aforesaid.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria, in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty-six sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was nil on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was plus four hundred-thousandths (or +·00004), and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being three thousandths of an ounce below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took from such residue six sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123·187 grains, the second 123·243 grains, the third 123·370 grains, the fourth 123·322 grains, the fifth 123·278 grains, the sixth 123·164 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first eighty-seven thousandths of a grain below (-·087), the second thirty-one thousandths of a grain below (-·031), the third ninety-six thousandths of a grain above (+·096), the fourth forty-eight thousandths of a grain above (+·048), the fifth four thousandths of a grain above (+·004), the sixth one hundred and ten thousandths of a grain below (-·110), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We then assayed the said six sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·64, the second 916·62, the third 916·79, the fourth 916·54, the fifth 916·82, the

sixth 916.32, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively—the first two hundred-thousandths below (-0.0002), the second four hundred thousandths below (-0.0004), the third thirteen hundred-thousandths above ($+0.0013$), the fourth twelve hundred-thousandths below (-0.0012), the fifth sixteen hundred-thousandths above ($+0.0016$), and the sixth thirty-four hundred-thousandths below (-0.0034), the standard fineness prescribed as aforesaid.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PERTH BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth, in the State of Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out two coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to forty eight sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was plus one thousandth of an ounce ($+0.01$ oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was plus one hundred-thousandth (or $+0.0001$), and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to

fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being one thousandth of an ounce above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took from such residue four sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123.268 grains, the second 123.256 grains, the third 123.310 grains, the fourth 123.289 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first six thousandths of a grain below (-0.006) the second eighteen thousandths of a grain below (-0.018), the third thirty-six thousandths of a grain above ($+0.036$), the fourth fifteen thousandths of a grain above ($+0.015$), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

We then assayed the said four sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.84, the second 916.44, the third 916.64, the fourth 916.59, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively—the first eighteen hundred-thousandths above ($+0.0018$), the second twenty two hundred-thousandths below (-0.0022), the third two hundred-thousandths below (-0.0002), the fourth seven hundred-thousandths below (-0.0007), the standard fineness prescribed as aforesaid.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS AMONG ESTABLISHED MEMBERS OF THE MINOR AND MANIPULATIVE GRADES OF THE CIVIL SERVICE FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Candidates must at the time of the examination be established members of the

Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service within the scope of the National Whitley Council; provided that Writing Assistants and members of the typing grades will not be eligible to compete.

2. Candidates must either (a) have had not less than three years' full-time service on duties proper to an adult class, or (b) have attained the age of 22 and have had not less than one year's full-time service on duties proper to an adult class.

3. Candidates must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st March of the year in which they are examined.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character; female candidates will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

5. The examination will be in the following subjects:—

1. English.
2. Arithmetic.
3. General Knowledge.
4. One of the following:—
Mathematics; French; German;
History; Geography; Economics.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will have regard, so far as vacancies permit, to the previous Departmental experience of the candidates and the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Successful candidates will be subject to a strict probation extending over a period of not less than one year; and failure to pass this probation will involve reversion.

8. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners; the application must be accompanied by a certificate from the authorities of the Department in which the candidate is serving, in the space provided on the application form, that he (or she) satisfies the conditions laid down in clauses 1 and 2 of these regulations and that his (or her) service has been approved.

9. A fee of £2 will be required from each candidate attending an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 4th October, 1932. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth and Preston.

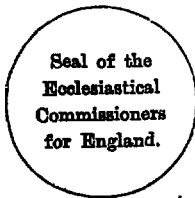
