The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees in the North Riding of the County of York did agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 1st day of October, 1931, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 17th day of December, 1931, to approve the Report of the Committee to the effect that, the Statutory Notice that the Petition had been presented having expired, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme in accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas on the 12th day of January, 1932, the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Samuel, one of His Majesty's Principal

Secretaries of State, did appoint Richard Cowdy Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Thornaby-on-Tees:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 14th day of April, 1932:—

“ SCHEME.

“ BOROUGH OF THORNABY-ON-TEES.

“ I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“ *Cleveland Ward.*

“ Cleveland Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as lies to the north of a line commencing at a point in the western boundary of the Borough where it is crossed by the Darlington & Saltburn line of railway belonging to the London & North Eastern Railway Company at the Railway Bridge over the River Tees and proceeding thence north-eastwards and eastwards along the centre of the said line of railway to a point opposite the centre of the west end of George Street thence eastward along the centre of George Street and Mandale Road to the junction of the latter with the County Road leading to Middlesbrough thence northwards along the centre of the cross street at the east end of Bonlea Terrace and Gladstone Street to the end of the said cross street thence due north to

the railway aforesaid and thence northeastward along the southeastern boundary of the railway to the boundary of the Borough.

" Mandale Ward.

" Mandale Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of the Borough where it is crossed by the County Road known as Acklam Road and thence proceeding northwestwards along the centre of the said road to its junction with Lanehouse Road thence westward along the centre of Lanehouse Road to its junction with Westbury Street thence northward along the centre of Westbury Street to its junction with Langley Avenue thence eastward along the centre of Langley Avenue to its junction with Mansfield Avenue thence northward along the centre of Mansfield Avenue and Mansfield Street to the junction of the latter with Mandale Road thence eastward along the centre of Mandale Road to its junction with the County Road leading to Middlesbrough aforesaid thence northward and northeastward along the southeastern boundary of Cleveland Ward hereinbefore described to the boundary of the Borough and thence in a generally southerly direction along the boundary of the Borough to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Westbury Ward.

" Westbury Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of Mandale Road with Mansfield Street and proceeding thence southward and westward along the western boundary of Mandale Ward as hereinbefore described to the junction of Langley Avenue with Westbury Street thence northwards along the centre of Westbury Street to its junction with Peel Street thence westward along the centre of Peel Street to its junction with Francis Street thence northward along the centre of Francis Street to its junction with George Street and thence eastward along the southern boundary of Cleveland Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Victoria Ward.

" Victoria Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of George Street with Francis Street and proceeding thence southward along the western boundary of Westbury Ward as hereinbefore described to the junction of Francis Street with Peel Street thence westward along the centre of Peel Street to its junction with Thornaby Road thence southward along the centre of Thornaby Road to a point opposite the southern boundary of No. 19, Stafford Place in Thornaby Road thence westward along the southern boundary of the Corporation Depot to the western boundary of the Borough in the centre of the River Tees thence northward along the western boundary of the Borough to the point where it is crossed by the Darlington & Saltburn line of Railway aforesaid and thence northeastward and eastward along the southern boundary of Cleveland Ward as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" St. Paul's Ward.

" St. Paul's Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough as is included within a line commencing at the junction of Westbury Street with Langley Avenue and proceeding thence southward along the western boundary of Mandale Ward hereinbefore described to the junction of Westbury Street with Lanehouse Road thence continuing southward along the centre of Thorntree Road to its junction with Beechwood Road thence westward along the centre of Beechwood Road to its junction with Thornaby Road thence due West to the western boundary of the Borough in the centre of the River Tees thence northward along the western boundary of the Borough to a point opposite the southern boundary of the Corporation Depot aforesaid and thence eastward northward eastward and southward along the southern boundary of Victoria and Westbury Wards as hereinbefore described to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Old Thornaby Ward.

" Old Thornaby Ward shall comprise the remaining portion of the Borough not comprised within the boundaries of the above-mentioned Wards as set out herein.

" Plan Delineating Boundaries.

" The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

" In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

" III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

" 1. The following Aldermen shall be respectively assigned as Returning Officers until the 9th day of November, 1932, at elections of

Councillors for the following Wards, namely:—

"2. If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving the Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

"3. If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at any election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme it shall be the duty of the Registration Officer for the Parliamentary Borough of Stockton-on-Tees to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the Register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election."

And whereas the said Scheme has been submitted to His Majesty in Council for approval:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby approve of the said Scheme of the said Commissioner and doth order the same to be published in the London Gazette accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of April, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Skilgate and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Upton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Skilgate and Upton duly made their Report

to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Skilgate and Upton are at present vacant:

"And whereas there is at Upton a house and premises suitable to become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted, which said house and premises are at present vested in the Trustees of a Charity known as 'The Parsonage Trust' but authority has been obtained for the transfer or conveyance of the said house and premises for the purposes of a Parsonage House for the said proposed United Benefice if and when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Skilgate and the said Benefice of Upton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Upton with Skilgate' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Skilgate and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Skilgate having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Upton having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly pre-

pared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of May, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for assigning the right of Patronage of the District of Saint Paul, East Ham, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 20th day of February, 1924, and published in the London Gazette on the 22nd day of the same month, the said District of Saint Paul, East Ham, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, constituted out of the Parish of East Ham in the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas no assignment of the Patronage of the said District of Saint Paul, East Ham, was made by the said Order and no such assignment has since been made:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said District of Saint Paul, East Ham:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Paul, East Ham, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the principal contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Paul, East Ham, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Paul, East Ham, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or

any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of May, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal Residence belonging to the See of Bath and Wells, which is situate at Wells in the County of Somerset:

"Whereas the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, now Bishop of the Diocese of Bath and Wells, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £150 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sums already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Bath and Wells:

"Now therefore with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal

to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £150 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 18 years or until the said sum of £150 with interest for the same as herein-after mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of twelve months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of twelve months so computed and at the end of every such like period of twelve months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one fifteenth part of the said principal sum of £150 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of twelve months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of forty days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such Mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said St. John Basil Wynne, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £150 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or

any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, and the New Parish of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of December, 1846, and published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of the same month a Chapelry District was assigned to the consecrated Church of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, situate in the Parish of Finchley, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, and such Chapelry District was named 'The Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, Finchley':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1911, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Jude, situate in the Hampstead Garden Suburb, in the Parish of Hendon, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London,

and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb':

"And whereas the said Chapelry District of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 8th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, which is bounded upon the south east partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Highgate, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Michael, Highgate, upon the south partly by a detached portion of the Parish of Saint Pancras and partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, Hampstead, upon the west partly by the District of St. Alban, Golders Green (all in the said County and Diocese), and partly by the said New

Parish of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, upon part of the north by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Finchley, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north and upon the north east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Finchley, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, at the south western corner of the Saint Marylebone Cemetery and extending thence south eastward along the wall or fence which divides such cemetery from certain houses and premises situate on the northern side of the road called Hill Top and along the fence forming the northern boundary of certain other houses and premises situate on the northern side of Hill Top for a distance in all of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence reaches the western side of the road called Ludlow Way, and extending thence eastward first across Ludlow Way to and then along the fence forming the northern boundary of certain other houses and premises situate on the northern side of Hill Top for a distance in all of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the fence forming the western boundary of certain houses and premises situate on the western side of the road called Ossulton Way, and extending thence northward along such fence for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 43, Ossulton Way, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Ossulton Way, and extending thence eastward in the same direction (thereby crossing Ossulton Way) for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the northern boundary of the Hampstead Garden Suburb, and extending thence generally eastward along such fence for a distance of $43\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of the road called Dean's Way, and extending thence first eastward to and then south eastward along the middle of Dean's Way for a distance of $16\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bishop's Avenue, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Bishop's Avenue for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the south western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 13, Bishop's Avenue, and extending thence south eastward to and along such fence for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its eastern end, and extending thence eastward in a straight line for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the western end of the fence forming the south western boundary of the house and premises known as Rheidol, Cherry Tree Hill, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned fence and along the fence forming the south western boundary of certain other houses and premises situate on the south western side of Cherry Tree Hill for a distance in all of 10 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Highgate."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c. of the Urban District Council of Heston and Isleworth, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas Sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, Section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas Section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Heston and Isleworth in the Administrative County of Middlesex, comprises the parish of Heston and Isleworth and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Heston and Isleworth are the local authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a charter of incorporation to create the Urban District of Heston and Isleworth a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers for that purpose contained in Section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Urban District Council of Heston and Isleworth are the Burial Board for a part of their District:

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a local education authority for Elementary Education, and a scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the Board of Education on the 21st day of July, 1931:

And whereas the District Council on the 11th day of January, 1904, under Section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1902, made Byelaws with respect to school attendance which were allowed by the Board of Education on the 12th day of May, 1904, and such Byelaws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 22nd day of June, 1920, under Section 13 of the Education Act, 1918, made Byelaws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by young persons which Byelaws were confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 20th day of October, 1920, and such Byelaws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council

have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Heston and Isleworth Scheme, 1932.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The appointed day” means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Heston and Isleworth;

“The Borough” means the Municipal Borough of Heston and Isleworth;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

“The District” means the existing Urban District of Heston and Isleworth;

“The District Council” means the existing Urban District Council of Heston and Isleworth;

“The Municipal Corporations Acts” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

“Duties” includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

“Liabilities” includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day;

“Local Authority” means a local authority as defined in Section 3 of the Local Government and Other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises, and immunities;

“Property” includes all property real and personal, and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property, real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation, whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS ETC. OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force of special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities in relation to the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the district shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property (not being property held on a Charitable Trust) or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the district shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the district shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6. Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit

or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation.

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a Borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed.

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a Burial Board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme, the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of:—

(a) The local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last-mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule) and

(b) Any other local Act, Provisional Order or Order having the force of an Act duly confirmed and affecting the district or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present session of Parliament)

as the same respectively are in force within the district immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order or in any Order having the force of an Act:—

(a) To the Heston and Isleworth Local Board or the Heston and Isleworth Urban

District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) To the Local Government District of Heston and Isleworth or the Urban District of Heston and Isleworth

shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any Local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District inure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10. Such of the provisions of:—

(a) The Baths and Washhouses Acts, 1846-1925;

(b) The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890 (Parts II., III., and V.);

(d) The Public Libraries Acts, 1892-1919;

(e) The Private Street Works Act, 1892;

(f) The Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899-1923;

(g) The Notification of Births Act, 1907;

(h) The Local Government and Other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

(i) The Public Health Act, 1925.

as shall have been adopted for the district immediately before the appointed day shall be in force and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

11.—(1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a town council acting as a burial board, shall extend to the Corporation acting as a burial board, and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

BYELAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

12.—(1) All byelaws made before the 1st January, 1921, which under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Heston and Isleworth Local Board or the Heston and Isleworth Urban District Council in:—

(a) Any byelaw, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees, and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) Any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority other than an Order relative to a charitable endowment;

which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Heston and Isleworth or the Urban District of Heston and Isleworth shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any byelaws made by the County Council of Middlesex under Section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the district shall until the 1st day of January, 1935, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those byelaws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the byelaws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by byelaws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

14.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Heston and Isleworth Urban District Council and the Urban District of Heston and Isleworth, and reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1932.

15. The said recited School Attendance byelaws and byelaws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by young persons made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

16.—(1) In case any officer of the District Council who was employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme, and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined having regard to the conditions and circumstances mentioned in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, and the compensation shall not exceed the limit therein mentioned.

Provided nevertheless that if any such officer shall be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with or if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within

four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) Any compensation payable to any officer shall be paid out of the General Rate Fund of the Borough and the provisions of the said Schedule (except paragraph 11 thereof) shall apply subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation, and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this article

(i) The expression "officer" includes a servant, and

(ii) A teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by the District Council or the Corporation, and if his services are dispensed with by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation, he shall be deemed to be an officer whose services are dispensed with by the Corporation.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

17.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

18.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

19.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or

against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council or their predecessors;

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action, or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

20. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary, or affect any power, right, interest or jurisdiction in or over or in connection with any charitable endowment.

21. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

22. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by, or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.
