The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Hendon and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882" :—

Whereas Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a petition for a charter of incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the municipal borough to be created by the charter the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place and also of any officer of that authority :

And whereas sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, section 1 of the School Boards Act, 1885, and section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882 :

And whereas section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under

the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by attaching to or vested in that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as or similar to those of that Act or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the Council of such borough :

And whereas the Urban District of Hendon in the administrative county of Middlesex comprises the parish of Hendon, and is an urban district for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council of Hendon are the local authority :

And whereas it is proposed by a charter of incorporation to create the Urban District of Hendon a municipal borough to incorporate its inhabitants and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts :

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Rural District of Hendon and the Urban Districts of Hendon and Kingsbury were constituted a parliamentary division and return one member to serve in Parliament :

And whereas in pursuance of the Education Act, 1921, the Urban District Council are a local education authority for elementary education, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was approved by the

Board of Education on 27th day of February, 1930:

And whereas the District Council on the 26th day of January, 1931, under Part IV of the Education Act, 1921, made Bye-laws with respect to school attendance which were allowed by the Board of Education on the 14th day of April, 1931, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas the District Council on the 24th day of February, 1920, and the 25th day of March, 1924, under Part VIII of the Education Act, 1921, made Bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by young persons which Bye-laws were confirmed by the Secretary of State on the 29th day of July, 1920, and the 24th day of June, 1924, respectively, and such Bye-laws now apply to the Urban District:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State and Ministers and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the School Boards Act, 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order, and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Hendon Scheme, 1932.

(2) In this Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The appointed day” means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Hendon;

“The Borough” means the Municipal Borough of Hendon;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

“The District” means the existing Urban District of Hendon;

“The District Council” means the existing Urban District Council of Hendon;

“The Municipal Corporation Acts” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

“Duties” includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty or for punishing the breach of any duty;

“Liabilities” includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would but for this Scheme be liable whether accruing before, on, or after the appointed day;

“Local Authority” means a local authority as defined in section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

“Property” includes all property, real and personal and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property real and personal, including things in action and all franchises,

rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC., OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the Council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881, or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the Council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force of special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5.—Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property (not being property held on a charitable trust) or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall

by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6.—Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of:—

(a) The local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule), and

(b) The Orders specified in the Third Schedule to this Scheme, and

(c) Any other local Act, Provisional Order or Order having the force of an Act, duly confirmed and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or con-

firmed during the present session of Parliament),

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order or in any Order having the force of an Act:—

(a) To the Hendon Local Board or the Hendon Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) To the Local Government District of Hendon or the Urban District of Hendon shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

10.—(1) All bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1922, which under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Hendon Local Board or the Hendon Urban District Council in:—

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority other than an Order relative to a charitable endowment;

which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Hendon or the Urban District of Hendon shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

11. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Middlesex under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, or under section 11 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act, 1928, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1935, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

12.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to

the Hendon Urban District Council and the Urban District of Hendon and reference to the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1932.

13. The said recited School Attendance by-laws and bye-laws with respect to the Employment of Children and Street Trading by young persons made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

14.—(1) In case any officer of the District Council who was employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined having regard to the conditions and circumstances mentioned in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, and the compensation shall not exceed the limit therein mentioned.

Provided nevertheless that if any such officer shall be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with or if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) Any compensation payable to any officer shall be paid out of the General Rate Fund of the Borough and the provisions of the said Schedule (except paragraph 11 thereof) shall apply subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the jurors book or the register of electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929, as applied by this article:—

(i) The expression "officer" includes a servant, and

(ii) A teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by the District Council or the Corporation, and if his services are dispensed with by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation, he shall be deemed to be an officer whose services are dispensed with by the Corporation.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

15.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their Committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

16.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

17.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council or their predecessors:

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

18. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any power, right, interest or jurisdiction in or over or in connection with any charitable endowment.

19. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

20. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by, or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

Whereas by Section 3 of the Wheat Act, 1932, it is provided that for the purpose of meeting the expenditure to be defrayed by the Wheat Commission under the said Act every miller and every importer of flour shall be liable to make to the Wheat Commission in respect of each hundredweight of his output of flour a payment (hereinafter referred to as "a quota payment") of an amount calculated and prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the said Section.

And whereas it is provided that the quota payments to be made in accordance with the provisions of the said Section shall be of such amount as may be prescribed by order of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

And whereas in Section 19 of the said Act it is provided that as respects the period beginning at the commencement of the Act and ending on the thirty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-three, if an Order prescribing the amount of quota payments comes into force on a date earlier than the first day of August, nineteen hundred and thirty-two, then, for the purpose of securing that the quota payments accruing due during the period beginning on the date on which the Order comes into force and ending on the thirty-first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-three, shall be proportionately reduced by reason of that period being a period greater than a year, Section 3 of the said Act shall in relation to such payments have effect subject to the following modifications, that is to say,

(i) All flour delivered between the date on which the first Order made under that Section comes into force and the first day of August nineteen hundred and thirty-two shall be deemed for the purposes of sub-

Section (1) of that Section to have been delivered in the cereal year beginning on the first day of August; and

(ii) References to the estimated supply of flour for a cereal year shall be construed as references to the estimated supply of flour for the period beginning on the date on which the first Order made under that Section comes into force and ending on the thirty-first day of July nineteen hundred and thirty-three and the amounts of the quota payments which will accrue due during that period shall be calculated and prescribed accordingly by an Order made as soon as practicable after the commencement of the said Act.

And whereas the Minister, after consultation with the Wheat Commission, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act has estimated

(a) that the average price obtainable by registered growers throughout the United Kingdom for home-grown millable wheat sold and to be sold by them in the cereal year ending on the 31st July, 1933, will be five shillings and nine pence per hundredweight and that the price deficit per hundredweight of such wheat will be four shillings and three pence per hundredweight; and

(b) that the supply of flour for the period beginning on 16th June, 1932, and ending on 31st July, 1933, that is to say, that part of the output of millers and importers of flour which, in the Minister's opinion, will in that period be delivered and retained for consumption or use in the United Kingdom, excluding meal to be consumed, without further manufacture, as animal or poultry food, is ninety-three million five hundred thousand hundredweights.

And whereas, after consultation with the Wheat Commission, the Minister has prescribed by an Order, the Wheat (Anticipated Supply) No. 1 Order, 1932, that the quantity of home-grown millable wheat of their own growing which he anticipates will be sold by registered growers during the cereal year beginning on the first day of August, 1932, is nineteen million eight hundred thousand hundredweights.

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries in exercise of the powers con-

ferred upon him by Sections 3 and 19 of the said Act hereby orders as follows:—

1. The quota payment which every miller and every importer of flour shall be liable to make to the Wheat Commission in respect of each hundredweight of his output of flour during the period commencing on the 19th day of June, 1932, and ending on the 31st day of July, 1933, shall be 10.8 pence.

2. This Order may be cited as the WHEAT (QUOTA PAYMENTS) No. 1 ORDER, 1932.
