WHEREAS by Section 2 of the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, provide for applying the provisions of Section 1 of the said Act, subject to the necessary modifications, to any part of His Majesty's dominions other than a self-governing dominion (as therein defined) in like manner as they apply to India, and, in particular, such Order in Council may determine the Court by which the jurisdiction conferred by those provisions is to be exercised:

And whereas the Colony of Jamaica is a part of His Majesty's dominions other than a self-governing dominion as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to provide for applying the aforesaid provisions of the said Act to the Colony of Jamaica:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in the exercise of the powers in this behalf by

the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order in Council may be cited as the Jamaica Divorce Jurisdiction Order in Council, 1932.

2. On and after the first day of August, 1932, the provisions of the first section of the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act, 1926, shall apply to the Colony of Jamaica in like manner as they apply to India.

3. In the application of the said provisions to the said Colony—

(a) The Court which is to exercise the jurisdiction thereby conferred shall be the Supreme Court of the Colony of Jamaica, and references in the said first section to a High Court in India shall be read as references to such Supreme Court;

(b) references in the said first section to India shall be read as references to the Colony of Jamaica; and

(c) the reference to the Secretary of State in Council of India in the said section shall be read as referring to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

WHEREAS by the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891 (54 and 55 Vict. cap. 36), His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular Officer in the execution of his office, and vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and abolish fees, and create new fees:

And whereas by the Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council 1931 the fee to be taken by Consular Officers for the issue of a passport has been fixed at fifteen shillings:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said fee in so far as it applies to the issue by Consular Officers in China of certain special passports known as Inland Travel Passes but not otherwise:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the before-mentioned Act, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Consular Fees (China Inland Travel Passes) Order in Council, 1932.

II. Henceforth Fee No. 76 shall not be charged in respect of the issue of Inland Travel Passes in China and the following fee shall be charged by Consular Officers in China for the issue of the said Passes:—

76A. Issue of Inland Travel Passes in China—8s. 0d.

III. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

And the Right Honourable Sir John Simon, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 26th day of May, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken

partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Chesterton and partly out of the Parish of Audley, both in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Chesterton and the said Parish of Audley, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Chesterton and of the said Parish of Audley, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and such Church is named 'The Church of Saint John, Alsagers Bank':

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish so soon as a Minister or Incumbent shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £250 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under Our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the site and fabric of the said Church of Saint John, Alsagers Bank, which was erected by the late Justinian Heathcote Edwards Heathcote, Esquire, at his own cost for the use of the inhabitants of the said proposed separate District or New Parish, have been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by the personal representatives of the said late Justinian Heathcote Edwards Heathcote upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said personal representatives of the late Justinian Heathcote Edwards Heathcote have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Lichfield, as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Chesterton and of the said Parish of Audley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the

boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of Saint John, Alsagers Bank.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of Saint John, Alsagers Bank, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint John, Alsagers Bank.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said John Augustine, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of Saint John, Alsagers Bank, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District) of Chesterton, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which is bounded upon the north and upon the west by the Parish of Audley, upon the south west by the Parish of Madeley, upon the south by the New Parish of Silverdale and Knutton Heath, upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Knutton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near the junction of the Apedale Branch line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway with the line of the mineral railway which runs past the Apedale Colliery and the Podmorehall Colliery, where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Knutton, from the said New Parish of Chesterton, crosses the middle of the line of the said mineral railway, and extending thence first north westward, then northward, and then again north westward along the middle of the line of such mineral railway for a distance of $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Chesterton from the Civil Parish of Audley, and extending thence northward along such Civil Parish Boundary for a distance of 33 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Chesterton from the said Parish of Audley.

"II. Also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Audley which is bounded upon the south and upon the east by the above described portion of the said new Parish of Chesterton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Chesterton from the said Parish of Audley at the junction of High Street (Wood Lane) with the roadway leading to Boon Hill, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 972 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Audley published in the year 1924 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first southward, then westward, and then again southward along the fences forming the eastern and southern boundaries of the said close numbered 972 and the eastern boundary of the close numbered 971 upon the said maps for a distance in all of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence reaches the northern side of Apedale Road, and continuing thence southward for a distance of 5 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Apedale Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Audley from the said New Parish of Chesterton.

"III. And also all that other contiguous portion of the said Parish of Audley which is bounded upon the east and upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Chesterton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Chesterton from the said Parish of Audley at the centre of the bridge which carries the Audley Branch line of the said London, Midland and Scottish Railway across the road leading from Alsagers Bank to Shralebrook, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Miles Green Road across it, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Miles Green Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Audley from the said New Parish of Chesterton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and

after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of April, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Cottered with Broadfield and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Throcking, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hertford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cottered with Broadfield and Throcking duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Albans and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Throcking and the Parish of the Benefice of Layston, situate in the said County of Hertford and in the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and the said Bishop of Saint Albans signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Saint Albans embodying certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Cottered with Broadfield and Throcking are at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Cottered with Broadfield and the said Benefice of Throcking shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Cottered with Broadfield and Throcking' but the Parishes

of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects:

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a more suitable Parsonage House at Cottered the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Throcking shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cottered with Broadfield and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith if not previously sold shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parsonage House at Cottered for the United Benefice:

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Cottered with Broadfield having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Throcking having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"5. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Layston, namely John Henry Buxton, of Easneye, Ware, in the said County of Hertford, Esquire; The Reverend Robert Charles Joynt, of Number 12, Kingswood Road, Norwood, in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, and Canon Residentiary of Southwark Cathedral; the Reverend Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, Clerk in Holy Orders and Canon Residentiary of Durham Cathedral; The Right Honourable Sir Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, of No. 3, Hare Court, Temple, C.B.E., K.C., M.P., and Sir Samuel Roberts, of Queen's Tower, Sheffield, in the County of York, Baronet, M.P. (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Alfred Howard as the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Layston, upon the union taking effect (a) all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Layston which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Throcking shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Throcking and (b) all those two detached portions of the Parish of the said Benefice of Throcking which are comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Layston shall be transferred and annexed for all

ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Layston.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Albans has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of April, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Rimpton and the Benefice of Marston Magna, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (*inter alia*) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Rimpton and Marston Magna duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Marston Magna is now full, the Reverend Alfred James Bartlett being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Rimpton is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Alfred James Bartlett (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Rimpton and the said Benefice of Marston Magna shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Marston Magna with Rimpton' (hereinafter called the United Benefice) but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred James Bartlett if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Marston Magna shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Marston Magna shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Rimpton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that so much of the net proceeds of such sale as shall seem to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to the

Bishop of Bath and Wells to be necessary shall be applied towards the cost of repairs and improvements to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice and the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Rimpleton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Marston Magna having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be

effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Report to His Majesty in Council, in the following terms:—

"That there is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Canterbury the Vicarage or Benefice of Dunkirk the Parish whereof contains a population of eight hundred and fifty-six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and ten persons and of the net annual value of three hundred and fifty-eight pounds or thereabouts.

"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Harbledown the Parish whereof contains a population of eight hundred and thirty-six or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for four hundred and fifty persons and of the net annual value of four hundred and twenty-eight pounds or thereabouts.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, all that portion of the Parish of Dunkirk which is verged red on the plan hereto annexed may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Dunkirk and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Harbledown to which it is contiguous.

"That it also appears to me that under the provisions of the said Act all that portion of the Parish of Harbledown which is verged green on the said plan may be advantageously separated from the Parish of Harbledown and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Dunkirk to which it is contiguous.

"That the Patronage of the Benefices of Dunkirk and Harbledown belong to me in right of my Archbishopric the Reverend Alfred Robert Jackman being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Dunkirk and the Reverend Sydney Richard Griggs being the present Incumbent of Harbledown.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Pluralities Act I have drawn up the following Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made

with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the consents thereto of myself as Patron of both the said Benefices and of the said Reverend Alfred Robert Jackman as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Dunkirk and of the Reverend Sydney Richard Griggs as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Harbledown I do certify by this my Report to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect.

“COSMO CANTUAR.”

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop and the Consents referred to in the said Report are as follows:—

“SCHEME.”

“That there shall be separated from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Dunkirk and annexed to the Parish of Harbledown all that portion of the Parish of Dunkirk which is verged red on the Plan hereto annexed.

“That there shall also be separated from the Parish of Harbledown and annexed to the Parish of Dunkirk all that portion of the Parish of Harbledown which is verged green on the same Plan hereto annexed.

“That the Incumbent of Dunkirk shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within the portion of the Parish of Harbledown so to be separated from Harbledown and annexed to Dunkirk and that likewise the Incumbent of Harbledown shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within the portion of the Parish of Dunkirk so to be separated from Dunkirk and annexed to Harbledown.

“That the inhabitants of such portions so to be separated shall be entitled to accommodation in the particular Parish Church of the Parish to which the portions are to be respectively annexed but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of the Parish from which such respective portions are separated except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

“That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions so to be separated shall have such and the same right to have marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the respective Parish Churches of the Parishes to which the portions are to be so annexed as they might have had in the Parish Church of the Parish from which such portions were respectively separated.

“That all fees, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (but excluding Tithes if any) arising from the said portions so to be respectively separated shall henceforth belong to the Incumbents for the time being of the Benefices to which such portions are respectively annexed.

“That no alteration shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

“That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

“CONSENTS.”

“We, the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, the Patron or person entitled to present to both the Benefices of Dunkirk and Harbledown (if the same or either of them were now vacant) the Reverend Alfred Robert Jackman Incumbent of the Benefice of Dunkirk and the Reverend Sydney Richard Griggs Incumbent of the Benefice of Harbledown do respectively signify our Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

“In testimony whereof we have set our hands this sixth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

(b) In earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the bodies of the following persons at their decease, viz., Elizabeth Kidd, Elizabeth Harbour, Fanny Peploe, Ellen Harriet Oakley, Louisa Howell, Rachael Burdett, Mary Ann Gilder, Sarah Lines, Fanny Bartlett, Sarah Annie Howell, and Eric Mildmay Turnill, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall in any case be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

WHEAT ACT, 1932.

BYELAWS OF THE WHEAT COMMISSION.

PART I.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO QUOTA PAYMENTS.

(A) *Ascertainment and payment of sums payable by millers in respect of quota payments.*

1. Every miller who in any week becomes liable to make quota payments in respect of any quantity of flour, shall, within fourteen days after the end of that week, deliver to the Wheat Commission a return, in the Form No. 1 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, specifying that quantity, and shall at the same time pay to the Commission the amount of the quota payments payable in respect thereof;

Provided that where a miller delivers, together with such a return as aforesaid, a

claim duly made for the allowance of a repayment in respect of any quantity of flour exported or shipped as stores by him or on his behalf during the week to which the return relates, he may deduct the amount of the repayment claimed from the amount payable under the foregoing provisions of this Byelaw on the delivery of the return, but without prejudice to his liability to pay forthwith, if the claim is disallowed, any quota payments remaining due from him in respect of his output of flour delivered in that week.

claim duly made for the allowance of a repayment in respect of any quantity of flour exported or shipped as stores by him or on his behalf during the week to which the return relates, he may deduct the amount of the repayment claimed from the amount payable under the foregoing provisions of this Byelaw on the delivery of the return, but without prejudice to his liability to pay forthwith, if the claim is disallowed, any quota payments remaining due from him in respect of his output of flour delivered in that week.

2. Every miller shall, within forty-two days after the end of each cereal year, deliver to the Wheat Commission a return in the Form No. 2 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, specifying the quantity of flour (if any) in respect of which he has during that year become liable to make quota payments.

3. Every return made by a miller under the foregoing provisions of these Byelaws shall contain a certificate, signed by the miller, vouching for the accuracy of the return.

Every certificate which is by this Byelaw required to be signed by a miller shall, in the case of a miller being a company, be signed on behalf of the company by an officer of the company duly authorised in that behalf or, in the case of a miller being a partnership, be signed on behalf of the partnership by one of the partners.

4. For the purpose of enabling the Wheat Commission to satisfy themselves that quota payments are duly made upon the quantities of flour in respect of which they accrue due, every miller shall, at such times as the Commission may determine, submit his books, records and accounts for examination by an auditor appointed by the Commission, who shall report to the Secretary of the Commission the result of the examination.

This Byelaw shall be without prejudice to any of the powers of investigation conferred on the Commission by the Act.

5. Upon receiving any sum in respect of quota payments from a miller, the Wheat Commission shall cause to be issued to him a receipt for the amount of that sum in the Form No. 3 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws.

(B) Ascertainment and payment of sums payable by importers of flour in respect of quota payments.

6. The amount of the quota payments which an importer estimates will accrue due from him in respect of any flour upon the entry thereof for home consumption or home use may be paid by him to the Wheat Commission before entry of the flour as aforesaid, and every such payment shall be accompanied by a statement that the flour in respect of which the payment is made has not yet been entered for home consumption or home use.

7. Upon receiving any sum paid to them by an importer under the last foregoing Byelaw, the Wheat Commission shall forthwith cause to be issued to the importer, or to such other person as he may have designated, a receipt for the amount of that sum, in the Form No. 4 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws.

8. Upon written application made to the Wheat Commission by any importer approved by them, the Commission may issue to the importer, in respect of quota payments which may accrue due from him, one or more receipts, without specifying therein any sum as having been received, and subject to the following provisions of this Byelaw, the importer or his agent may, for the purpose of enabling the proper officer of Customs and Excise to sign the entry of any quantity of flour for home consumption or home use made by or on behalf of the importer, cause to be written on any such receipt the amount of the quota payments accruing due from the importer upon that entry.

The issue of any receipt to an importer under this Byelaw shall be subject to the following conditions, that is to say:—

(a) the receipt shall remain the property of the Wheat Commission, and shall, unless it has already been surrendered to the proper officer of Customs and Excise for the purposes of section six of the Act, be returned to the Commission by the importer forthwith upon his receiving from them a written request in that behalf;

(b) if the Commission so require, the importer shall, before the issue of the receipt, give to the Commission such security, by bond or otherwise, as they may direct, for the payment in accordance with these Byelaws of all quota payments which may accrue due from him during such period not ex-

ceeding one year as the Commission may specify.

Every receipt issued under the foregoing provisions of this Byelaw shall be in the Form No. 5 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws.

9. All quota payments payable by an importer shall be paid by him within fourteen days after the date on which they accrued due.

10. Where any parcel of flour is entered by or on behalf of any importer for home consumption or home use, then if the Wheat Commission have in hand, or subsequently receive from that importer, any sum in respect of the quota payments due in respect of that flour, they shall cause to be issued to him a definitive receipt in the Form No. 6 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, for the amount of that sum or the amount of those quota payments, whichever is the less, and any amount which has, before the entry of the flour as aforesaid, been paid in respect thereof in excess of the amount of the said quota payments shall, according as the importer may request, either be repaid to him by the Commission or be credited to him on account of quota payments in respect of such other parcel of flour as he may designate to the Commission.

(C) Making and allowance of payments to exporters in respect of flour exported or shipped as stores and in respect of exported bread.

11. Every application for the making or allowance of a repayment in respect of any parcel of flour exported or shipped as stores shall be made by the exporter to the Wheat Commission in the Form No. 7 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, stating:—

(a) the name and business address of the exporter;

(b) the quantity of flour constituting the parcel;

(c) the date on which the parcel was entered by him or on his behalf for exportation or shipment as stores, and that it has been duly exported or shipped as stores;

and stating whether the exporter desires the repayment to be made or to be allowed to him.

12. No application made under the last foregoing Byelaw shall be granted by the Wheat Commission unless—

(a) they are satisfied that quota payments have been duly made in respect of the flour which is the subject of the application; and

(b) there is produced and surrendered to them a certificate, signed by the proper officer of Customs and Excise, certifying that the quantity of flour specified in the application has on the date stated therein been duly entered by or on behalf of the exporter for exportation or shipment as stores, and has, on the date specified in the certificate, been duly exported or shipped as stores;

and for the purpose of satisfying themselves as aforesaid, the Commission may require such evidence (including statutory declarations) as they consider relevant.

13. Every application for the making or allowance of a repayment in respect of any parcel of exported bread shall be made by the exporter to the Wheat Commission in the Form

No. 8 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, specifying:—

(a) the name and business address of the exporter;

(b) the quantity of bread constituting the parcel;

(c) the date on which the parcel was exported;

and stating whether the exporter desires the repayment to be made or to be allowed to him.

14. No application made under the last foregoing Byelaw in respect of any bread shall be granted by the Wheat Commission unless they are satisfied—

(a) that the bread was exported on the date specified in the application; and

(b) that all the flour from which the bread was made was flour in respect of which quota payments have been duly made;

and for the purpose of so satisfying themselves as aforesaid, the Commission may require such evidence (including statutory declarations) as they consider relevant.

15. No application for a repayment shall be entertained in respect of any flour, unless it is made within three months after the date on which the flour was exported or shipped as stores, as the case may be, or in respect of any bread, unless it is made within seven days after the end of the week in which the bread was exported.

(D) *Exemption of millers from liability to make quota payments in respect of meal.*

16. Every application by a miller for the issue of a provender miller's certificate shall be made to the Wheat Commission in the Form No. 9 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, and shall contain a declaration signed by the miller that the whole of his output during the cereal year in respect of which the certificate is required has not comprised, and will not comprise, any flour other than meal delivered or to be delivered for consumption, without further manufacture, as animal or poultry food.

17. Every provender miller's certificate shall be in the Form No. 10 set out in the First Schedule to these Byelaws, and shall be issued subject to the condition that the certificate must be returned by the miller to the Wheat Commission forthwith, if at any time he delivers, as part of his output, any flour other than meal, or so delivers any meal otherwise than for consumption, without further manufacture, as animal or poultry food.

18. For the purpose of satisfying themselves that the output, or any hundredweight of the output, of a miller consists only of meal delivered by him for consumption, without further manufacture, as animal or poultry food, the Wheat Commission may require such evidence (including statutory declarations) as they consider relevant.

(E) *Supplementary Provisions.*

19. As respects any flour consisting of a mixture to which this Byelaw applies, the substances contained therein which are not produced by the milling of wheat shall be deemed not to form part of the flour.

The mixtures to which this Byelaw applies are—

Self-raising Flour.
Compound Mustard.
Krusto.
Almata.

20. Any dispute arising as to whether any substance is flour, or as to whether any substance is bread, shall be referred to the arbitration of a member of a panel of referees appointed for the purpose by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, and the decision of the referee with respect to the matter in dispute shall be final and conclusive.

The Arbitration Act, 1889, shall not apply in relation to any reference under this Byelaw, but the referee shall, as soon as practicable after entering on the reference, give his decision thereon in the form of a written award signed by him, and shall deliver the award to the Wheat Commission and a copy thereof certified by him to any party to the dispute who applies for it.

21. In this part of these Byelaws the expression "week" means a period of seven days beginning on Sunday, or on such other day as the Commission may in any special case direct.

PART II.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO REGISTRATION OF GROWERS OF WHEAT.

22. The Wheat Commission shall keep a register of growers of wheat (hereinafter referred to as "the register"), and every person who is growing wheat in the United Kingdom shall, on application made to the Commission in accordance with these Byelaws, be entitled to be registered in the said register as a grower of home-grown millable wheat.

23. Every application for registration in the register shall be made in the Form No. 11 set out in the Second Schedule to these Byelaws, stating the name and address of the applicant, and specifying every farm in the United Kingdom on which he is growing wheat at the date of the application, the area of such farms, and the number of acres on such farms under wheat at that date.

24. The register shall be kept at the principal office of the Wheat Commission, and upon a written application made in that behalf by any person, the Commission may, if they think fit, allow that person to inspect the register and take copies of any entry therein.

25. If, at any time during a cereal year, a registered grower makes to the Wheat Commission a written application for the removal of his name from the register, or the Commission ascertain that a registered grower has ceased to grow wheat in the United Kingdom, the Commission shall cause his name to be removed from the register at the end of that cereal year or at the end of six months after the date on which he ceased so to grow wheat, whichever occurs the later.

Provided that—

(a) upon written application made in that behalf by a registered grower who has ceased to grow wheat in the United Kingdom; or

(b) upon ascertaining that a registered grower has died;

the Commission shall cause his name to be forthwith removed from the register.

26. If at any time the Wheat Commission ascertain that the name of any person has been improperly entered in the register, the Commission shall cause his name to be forthwith removed therefrom.

PART III

SUPPLEMENTARY.

27. If, upon application made to them in writing, the Wheat Commission are satisfied that any document issued by them for the purposes of the Act or of these Byelaws has been lost or destroyed, the Commission may issue to the applicant a copy, which shall, subject to such conditions as the Commission may impose, have effect as the original document.

28. In these Byelaws the expression "the Act" means the Wheat Act, 1932, and the expressions "miller" and "importer" mean respectively a miller of flour and an importer of flour.

The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the interpretation of these Byelaws as it applies for the interpretation of an Act.

29. These Byelaws may be cited as the Wheat (Quota Payments and Registration) Byelaws, 1932.

These Byelaws have been duly made by the Wheat Commission in the exercise of their powers under the Wheat Act, 1932, in witness whereof the Common Seal of the Wheat Commission is hereunto affixed this Fifteenth day of June, 1932.

The following incomplete extracts from the Wheat Act and the Byelaws of the Wheat Commission are appended for general guidance only. Persons responsible for making this return should make themselves acquainted with the provisions of the Act and the Byelaws of the Commission. (Copies of the Byelaws can be obtained from the Wheat Commission.)

Wheat Act. Section 3 (1). "For the purpose of meeting the expenditure to be defrayed by the Wheat Commission under this Act every miller and every importer of flour shall be liable to make to the Wheat Commission in respect of each hundredweight of his output of flour a payment (hereinafter referred to as a quota payment) of an amount calculated and prescribed in accordance with the provisions of the Section . . ."

Section 3 (2). "The quota payment in respect of any hundredweight of the output of a miller or importer of flour shall accrue due when that hundredweight is delivered."

Byelaws relating to quota payments. "(1) Every miller who in any week becomes liable to make quota payments in respect of any quantity of flour, shall, within fourteen days after the end of that week make and deliver to the Wheat Commission a return . . . specifying that quantity, and shall at the same time pay to the Commission the amount of the quota payments payable in respect thereof."

"(3) Every return made by a miller . . . shall contain a certificate signed by the miller. . . . Every certificate . . . shall, in the case of a miller being a company, be signed on behalf of the company by an officer of the company duly authorised in that behalf or in the case of a miller being a partnership, be signed on behalf of the partnership by one of the partners."

The following definitions are contained in the Wheat Act, Section 20 (1):—

"Miller" includes every person who, by way of trade, mills wheat in the United Kingdom for the purpose of producing flour.

"Flour" means the products produced by the milling of wheat, and includes all such products except substances separated in the milling as wheat offals, and (subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section) where such products as aforesaid are mixed with other substances whether or not produced by the milling of wheat, and whether milled with the wheat or subsequently added, the mixture shall be deemed to be flour.

"Output" means (subject to the provisions of sub-sections (2) and (3) of this section) in relation to a miller, the flour produced by him in the United Kingdom which is delivered by him. . . .

"Delivered" means in relation to the output of a miller delivered by him on sale or otherwise for consumption or use either by himself or any other person

"Meal" means wheatmeal as defined by the Fourth Schedule to the Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1926, either alone or mixed with other substances not being flour Section 3, and sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 20 of the Wheat Act should be referred to by millers engaged in preparation of mixtures and products containing flour but not sold under the name of flour, etc.

Sub-section 3 (b) of Section 20 provides that in computing the output of any miller:—
 "(b) there shall be deducted from the quantity which, but for the provisions of this paragraph, would have been the quantity of his output of flour, so much of that quantity as he proves to the satisfaction of the Wheat Commission to have formed part of the output of some other miller or of an importer of flour, as computed in accordance with the provisions of the Act."
