SUPREME COURT OF JUDICATURE (CONSOLIDATION) ACT, 1925.

SECTION 51.

The following Order has been made by the High Court of Justice against Alfred Thomas Newman and Annie Newman, of Belstone House, Crediton, in the County of Devon.

Monday, 20th day of June, 1932.

In the High Court of Justice—King's Bench Division.

In the matter of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925, Section 51, and in the matter of ALFRED THOMAS NEWMAN and ANNIE NEWMAN.

Upon the motion of and upon hearing Mr. Attorney-General of Counsel and upon reading the several affidavits of Walter George Gill Seagar, Lewis Henry Martin and John Bareham Allbrook and the exhibits therein referred to filed in support of such Motion. No one appearing on behalf of the said Alfred Thomas Newman and Annie Newman.

It is ordered that no legal proceedings shall be instituted by the said Alfred Thomas Newman and Annie Newman in the High Court or in any other court unless they obtain the leave of the High Court or some Judge thereof and satisfy the Court or Judge that such legal proceeding is not an abuse of the process of the Court and that there is a prima facie ground for such proceeding.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1888.

ALTERATIONS TO THE COUNTY BOUNDARY BETWEEN THE COUNTIES OF HOLLAND AND ISLE OF ELY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the County Councils of the Administrative County of the parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, and of the Administrative County of the Isle of Ely, Cambridgeshire, have presented a Joint Memorial under their respective Common Seals to the Minister of Health under Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, praying that he will make an Order to carry out and cause to be introduced into Parliament a Bill to confirm such Order, the following alterations of the County Boundary:—

1. The use of the centre of South Eau Drain as the County Boundary in the parishes of Sutton St. Edmund, Parson Drove and Tydd St. Mary from the Holland County Boundary on the west of Inkerson Fen to the point where the boundary crosses the same Drain south of Harold's Bridge.

2. The use of Lowgate Cut, the Shire Drain and Angle Cut as the County Boundary in the parishes of Tydd St. Mary and Tydd St. Giles in place of the Shire Drain as the boundary.

And that duplicates of the Memorial and the Maps have been deposited at the County Hall, Boston, and the County Hall, March, and will be open to inspection at both places on ordinary weekdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. and on Saturdays between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon without payment.
