WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of August, 1932 (N. 2277/32), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the formation of a special reserve of Wireless Operators will be of value to Your Majesty's Navy:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the formation of a Reserve to be known as the Royal Naval Wireless Auxiliary Reserve, whose members shall sign an undertaking to serve in Your Majesty's Navy in time of war or emergency, to be administered under such regula-

tions as we may from time to time determine: and that each member of such Reserve shall, upon being called into Active Service, be eligible to be paid a bounty of Five Pounds.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, payment at the rate of 4s. a day for Paymaster Cadets of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we consider that justification no longer exists for paying these Cadets on a higher scale than that paid to other Naval Cadets:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the revised scale of pay shown in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"Paymaster Cadets, Royal Navy, entered on or after 1st September, 1933, are to be paid on the following scale:—

When in a Training Ship, 1s. a day.

When in a seagoing ship not a Training Ship, 4s. a day.

"The above rates not to be subject to alteration on account of variations in the cost of living figures."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Naval Forces Act, 1903, men are entered for Special Service as Ordinary Seamen, rising to Able Seaman and Leading Seaman:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to extend the Special Service system to the Tele-

graphist Branch and to enter men as Ordinary Telegraphists, rising to Telegraphist and Leading Telegraphist, at the following rates of pay, viz.:—

"And whereas we consider that Naval Officers of the Fleet Air Arm of or below the rank of Lieutenant-Commander serving at the Admiralty should receive an allowance when carrying out flying practice as pilots:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the arrangements contained in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"A Naval Officer of the Fleet Air Arm of or below the rank of Lieutenant-Commander serving at the Admiralty is to receive an allowance at the rate of 4s. a day, in addition to Admiralty allowance, for any days on which he makes an ascent and himself acts as pilot.

"Payment of the allowance is to take effect from the 14th June, 1932."

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the County Courts Act, 1903, that His Majesty may by Order in Council provide that actions in which the plaintiff claims a sum exceeding £50 by virtue of the said Act shall be tried in any Court where His Majesty is satisfied that due provision has been made for the trial of such actions without interference with the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that due provision has been made in every County Court for the trial of such actions as aforesaid without interference with the ordinary jurisdiction of the Court:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Actions in which the plaintiff claims a sum exceeding £50 by virtue of the County Courts Act, 1903, shall be tried in the Court in which the action was commenced.

2. The following Orders shall be revoked:—

The County Courts Order in Council, 1924.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1927.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1928.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1930.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1931.

The County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction No. 2) Order in Council, 1931.

3. Nothing in this Order shall affect any power to transfer an action from one Court to another under any provision of the County Courts Act, 1888, or of the County Courts Act, 1919.

4. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1932, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of November, 1932.

the Irish Free State (Consequential Adaptation of Enactments) Order, 1923, it is enacted that His Majesty The King may, by Order in Council, apply that section to any British Possession where His Majesty is satisfied that, by the Law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death, or that the Law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provisions of that Section:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Law of the Province of Quebec as respects the duty leviable in respect of property situate in Great Britain when passing on death is to the like effect as the provisions of sub-section (1) of the aforesaid Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, should be applied to the Province of Quebec:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall apply to the Province of Quebec as from the date on which this Order is made.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish (sometime District under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850), of Saint Paul, Withington, and partly out of the Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, both within the original limits of the Parish of Manchester, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, and the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor

Road, Didsbury, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portion of the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, and of the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we are satisfied that an adequate and permanent maintenance for the support of the Minister of the said proposed District, and when the said District shall have become a New Parish, then for the support of the Incumbent thereof, will be secured as from the date of the licensing or appointment of such Minister or Incumbent by the payment of a sum of not less than £150, which will be annually provided out of the moneys received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the said Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850:

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, and of the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Christopher, Withington.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Christopher, Withington, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish (some-time District under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850) of Saint Paul, Withington, within the original limits of the Parish of Manchester, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the north east by the Parish of the Holy Innocents, Fallowfield, upon the north by the Parish of Saint Crispin, Withington, upon the north west by the Parish of Saint Werburgh, Chorlton cum Hardy, upon the south west by the Parish (sometimes District) of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, all in

the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, from the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, at a point in the middle of the Cheadle Heath and Manchester Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway opposite to the middle of Meltham Avenue, and extending thence north eastward to and along the middle of Meltham Avenue for a distance of $26\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitechurch Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Whitechurch Road for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the premises attached to Old Moat School, and extending thence first north eastward to and then first north eastward and then in various directions along such wall or fence for a distance in all of 9 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Hough Road, and extending thence first south eastward to and then north eastward along the middle of Hough Road for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Old Hall Lane and extending thence north westward along the middle of Old Hall Lane for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Huntington Avenue, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Huntington Avenue for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dennison Avenue, and extending thence first south eastward and then north eastward along the middle of Dennison Avenue for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Heswall Avenue, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Heswall Avenue for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yewtree Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Yewtree Road for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, from the said Parish of the Holy Innocents, Fallowfield.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, which is bounded upon the north east by the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the southeast, upon the southwest and upon the northwest, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, from the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, at the centre of the bridge which carries Burton Road across the said Cheadle Heath and Manchester Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Burton Road for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cavendish Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Cavendish Road for a distance of $34\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Princess Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Princess Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across

the said Cheadle Heath and Manchester Line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, from the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Saint Paul, Withington, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since the transmission of the drafts of the said Scheme as aforesaid:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Christ Church, Barlow Moor Road, Didsbury, has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Rattlesden, in the County of Suffolk, and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas by a Codicil dated the 12th day of December, 1929, to the Will dated the 15th day of February, 1924, of the late Reverend Ernest John Wild, of Saxonhurst, Wadhurst, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Rattlesden was devised to the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being:

"And whereas the said Ernest John Wild died on the 16th day of September, 1931:

"And whereas William Wild, of Number 43, Mincing Lane, in the City of London, Solicitor, and Gladys Lavinia Mary Wild, of Saxonhurst, Wadhurst, in the said County of Sussex, Spinster, are the executors of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson would now be vested, and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Rattlesden should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Rattlesden which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Rattlesden:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Wild and Gladys Lavinia Mary Wild (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Ernest John Wild, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette

of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Rattlesden shall be transferred to the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Supplemental Scheme bearing date the 14th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplemental Scheme under the 25th section of that Act with reference to the United Benefice and Rectory of Holy Trinity with Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 9th day of May, 1892, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month, uniting the Benefice of Upper Chelsea and the Benefice of Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, it was directed that the Church of Saint Jude,

Upper Chelsea, should be left standing, and should be used as a Chapel of Ease to the Church of the said United Benefice, and for the performance therein of Divine Service, or for any purpose or purposes authorised by section 19 of the said Act, so long as the Bishop of the Diocese should by his licence permit:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, has certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by a certificate under his hand and Episcopal Seal dated the 26th day of January, 1932, that he has refused or withdrawn his licence or permission for the use of the said Church of Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, as a Chapel of Ease to the Church of the said United Benefice, and for the performance therein of Divine Service or for any purpose or purposes authorized by section 19 of the said Act:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be desirable that notwithstanding the fact that full services have ceased to be held in the said Church of Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, the said yearly sum or stipend of £166 should continue to be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Rector or Incumbent of the said United Benefice:

"And whereas it appears to us to be desirable also that the provision contained in the said Order in Council that the proceeds of any sale or sales of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, are to be applied towards the cost of building a new Church within the limits of the Metropolis should be amended so that the area within which such new Church may be built shall be extended to the vicinity of the Metropolis as defined by the Union of Benefices Act, 1898:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), with the consent of the Right Honourable Gerald Oakley, Earl Cadogan, as the Patron of the said United Benefice (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Parochial Church Council of the United Parish of Holy Trinity with Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea (in testimony of which consent this Scheme is signed by the Chairman presiding at a Meeting of the Parochial Church Council held for the purpose of giving such consent and by two other Members of the Council present at such Meeting), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that the provisions of the said Order in Council of the 9th day of May, 1892, shall be altered and varied so that (1) as from the 26th day of

January, 1932, the said yearly sum or stipend of £166 shall be transferred and annexed to the said United Benefice and Rectory of Holy Trinity with Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, as part of the endowments thereof, and (2) the area within which a new Church may be erected out of the proceeds of any sale or sales of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Jude, Upper Chelsea, shall not be limited to the Metropolis but shall include the vicinity of the Metropolis as defined by the Union of Benefices Act, 1898.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Supplemental Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Supplemental Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Brislington, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Anne, Brislington, and of the New Parish (sometime

District) of the Holy Nativity, Knowle (both in the said County and Diocese), which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Brislington, of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Brislington, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Christopher, Brislington, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Brislington as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Brislington, and of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Brislington, of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Brislington, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Christopher, Brislington, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Brislington.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Christopher, Brislington, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Parish of Brislington, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south east, upon the south and upon the south west by the Parish of Whitchurch, in the said County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, upon the north west partly by the Parish of Bedminster, partly by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, and partly by the New Parish (sometime District) of the Holy Nativity, Knowle, upon the north by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Anne, Brislington, upon part of the east by the District of Saint Cuthbert, Brislington, all in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol, and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of Saint Cuthbert, Brislington, from the said Parish of Brislington, at the junction of Bath Road, Wick Road and the road called Grove Park, and extending thence southward along the middle of Grove Park for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Water

COUNTY OF LONDON.

CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas by an Order made by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State on the third day of November, 1930, in pursuance of the power vested in him under section 12 of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the County of London was divided into six coroners' districts as set out in the schedule to such order.

And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the right of any person having power to appoint a franchise coroner shall cease on the next vacancy in the office which occurs after the passing of that Act and for all purposes relating to coroners the area in which the franchise coroner had jurisdiction shall thereupon if and so far as it is not situated in a borough the Council of which has power to appoint a borough coroner, be merged in the County.

And whereas on the eighteenth day of March, 1932, a vacancy occurred in the office of franchise coroner for the Borough of Southwark in the County of London.

And whereas the London County Council has pursuant to section 12 of the above-mentioned Act and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for the alteration of certain of the existing divisions of the County of London by the inclusion therein of the area which on the occurrence of the said vacancy merged in the said County.
