**WHEREAS** a majority of the whole Council of the City of Norwich did on the 15th September, 1931, agree to petition, and the Council of the said City thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the boundaries of the Wards of the said City:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 26th day of October, 1931, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 17th day of December, 1931, to approve the Report of the Committee to the effect that, the Statutory Notice that the Petition had been presented having expired, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme in accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas on the 12th day of January, 1932, the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Samuel, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to

be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the City of Norwich:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 25th day of June, 1932:—

" SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE CITY OF NORWICH AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 17TH DECEMBER, 1931.

" 1. BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

" *Conesford Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Wensum immediately under the centre of Duke's Palace Bridge, thence north-eastward, eastward and southward along the centre of the River Wensum to a point immediately under the centre of Foundry Bridge, thence westward along the centre of Foundry Bridge and Prince of Wales Road to the junction of Prince of Wales Road with Mountergate, thence south-westward and westward along the centre of Mountergate and Stepping Lane to the junction of Stepping Lane with Golden Ball Street, thence southward along the centre of Golden Ball Street to its junction with All Saints' Street, thence south-westward along the centre of All Saints' Street to its junction with All Saints' Green, thence southward along the centre of All

Saints' Green to its junction with Queen's Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Queen's Road, Chapel Field Road and Grapes Hill to the junction of Grapes Hill with Pottergate thence eastward along the centre of Pottergate to its junction with St. John Maddermarket, thence northward along the centre of St. John Maddermarket and Duke Street to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*Note.*—Within the boundary of the ward as herein defined and wholly surrounded by the County Borough of Norwich but not forming part thereof is situated the detached area forming part of the administrative County of Norfolk in which stand the Shire Hall and other county buildings.

*" Ber Street Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Queen's Road at its junction with All Saints' Green, thence north-eastward and eastward following the south-eastern boundary of Conesford Ward as hereinbefore defined to a point in the centre of Foundry Bridge immediately over the centre of the River Wensum, thence southward and south-eastward along the centre of the River Wensum to a point opposite the centre of the Private Road at Carrow Works which forms the continuation of Carrow Hill, thence westward along the centre of such Private Road and Carrow Hill to the junction of Carrow Hill with Bracondale, thence north-westward along the centre of Bracondale to its junction with Queen's Road, thence westward along the centre of Queen's Road to its junction with Hall Road, thence south-westward and southward along the centre of Hall Road to its junction with Trafalgar Street, thence westward along the centre of Trafalgar Street and north-westward along the centre of Southwell Road to the junction of Southwell Road with Ashby Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of Ashby Street to its junction with Queen's Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Queen's Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Westwick Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Earlham Road at its junction with Heigham Road, thence northward along the centre of Heigham Road and Old Palace Road to the junction of Old Palace Road with Devonshire Street, thence eastward and north-eastward along the centre of Devonshire Street to its junction with Heigham Street, thence south-eastward along the centre of Heigham Street to its junction with Station Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Station Road to a point immediately over the centre of the River Wensum, thence southward and eastward along the centre of the River Wensum to a point immediately under the centre of Duke's Palace Bridge, thence southward, westward and southward, following the boundary of Conesford Ward as hereinbefore defined, to its junction with Earlham Road, thence westward along the centre of Earlham Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Coslany Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Aylsham Road at its junction with St.

Martin's Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Aylsham Road to its junction with Patteson Road, thence eastward along the centre of Patteson Road to its junction with Waterloo Road, thence southward along the centre of Waterloo Road to its junction with Shipstone Road, thence eastward along the centre of Shipstone Road to its junction with Magdalen Road, thence southward along the centre of Magdalen Road and Magdalen Street to a point in the centre of Fye Bridge immediately over the centre of the River Wensum, thence westward and northward following the boundaries of Conesford Ward and Westwick Ward as hereinbefore defined along the centre of the River Wensum and continuing along the centre of the River Wensum to a point opposite the terminus of The Watering, thence south-eastward along the centre of The Watering to its junction with St. Martin's Road, thence northward along the centre of St. Martin's Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Fye Bridge Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Magdalen Road at its junction with Beaconsfield Road, thence eastward along the centre of Beaconsfield Road and Mousehold Avenue to the junction of Mousehold Avenue with Gurney Road, thence southward along the centre of Gurney Road to its junction with Britannia Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Britannia Road to its junction with Ketts Hill, thence north-westward along the centre of Ketts Hill to its junction with Bishop Bridge Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Bishop Bridge Road to its junction with a line continued eastward from the centre of Bishop Bridge, thence westward along the said line and continuing along the centre of Bishop Bridge to a point immediately over the centre of the River Wensum, thence northward and westward following the boundary of Conesford Ward as hereinbefore defined along the centre of the River Wensum to its junction with the boundary of Coslany Ward, thence northward following the eastern boundary of Coslany Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Thorpe Ward.*

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Gurney Road at its junction with Mousehold Avenue, thence north-eastward along the centre of Gurney Road to its junction with the City boundary, thence southward following the City boundary to its junction with the River Yare, thence eastwards following the City boundary along the north bank of the River Yare to Hardley Cross, thence following the City boundary across the River Yare and westward along the south bank of the River Yare and the River Wensum to the point where the City boundary leaves the River Wensum and continuing westward along the centre of the River Wensum to its junction with the boundary of Ber Street Ward, thence northward following the eastern boundaries of Ber Street Ward and Conesford Ward as hereinbefore defined along the centre of the River Wensum to its junction with the boundary of Fye Bridge Ward, thence eastward, northward, south-eastward, north-eastward, north-westward and northward, following the boundary

of Eye Bridge Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Lakenham Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the Southwell Road Railway Bridge immediately above the centre of the track of the London and North Eastern Railway, thence eastward, northward, north-eastward and eastward following the southern boundary of Ber Street Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the River Wensum, thence eastward along the centre of the River Wensum to its junction with the City boundary, thence south-westward following the City boundary to its intersection with the track of the London and North Eastern Railway line to Ipswich, thence northward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Town Close Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Unthank Road at its junction with Mile End Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Unthank Road to its junction with Gloucester Street, thence south-eastward along the centre of Gloucester Street to its junction with New Market Street, thence north-eastward along the centre of New Market Street to its junction with Brunswick Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Brunswick Road to its junction with Newmarket Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Newmarket Road and St. Stephen Road to the junction of St. Stephen Road with Queen's Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Queen's Road to its junction with the western boundary of Ber Street Ward, thence south-eastward and south-westward following the boundary of Ber Street Ward to its junction with the boundary of Lakenham Ward at its northwest corner, thence southward following the western boundary of Lakenham Ward to its junction with the City boundary, thence westward following the City boundary to a point under the centre of Harford Bridge, thence north-eastward and northward along the centre of Ipswich Road to its junction with Eaton Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Eaton Road to its junction with Newmarket Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Newmarket Road to its junction with Mile End Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Mile End Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"St. Stephen Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Unthank Road at its junction with Gloucester Street, thence south-eastward, north-eastward, south-eastward and north-eastward following the northern boundary of Town Close Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the southwest boundary of Conesford Ward, thence north-westward following the boundary of Conesford Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with Unthank Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Unthank Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Eaton Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Yare in a straight line with the northern boundary of the field numbered 498 on the 2500 Ordnance Map (Second Edition 1907),

thence north-eastward following the said line and the boundary of the said field to its junction with the western boundary of the field numbered 499 on the said Map, thence north-eastward, north-westward and north-eastward, following the said boundary of field 499 to its junction with Bluebell Road, thence following a straight line to a point in the centre of North Park Avenue at its junction with Bluebell Road, thence eastward and north-eastward along the centre of North Park Avenue, Jessopp Road and Portersfield Road to the junction of Portersfield Road with Avenue Road, thence eastward along the centre of Avenue Road to its junction with Park Lane, thence south-eastward along the centre of Park Lane to its junction with the north-western boundary of St. Stephen Ward, thence south-westward following the said boundary of St. Stephen Ward and continuing south-westward, south-eastward and southward following the western boundary of Town Close Ward, both as hereinbefore defined, to the junction of the boundary of Town Close Ward with the City boundary, thence westward, north-westward and northward, following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Nelson Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Dereham Road at its junction with Helena Road, thence eastward along the centre of Dereham Road to its junction with the western boundary of Westwick Ward, thence southward and eastward following the boundary of Westwick Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of St. Stephen Ward, thence south-westward following the boundary of St. Stephen Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the northern boundary of Eaton Ward, thence westward following the boundary of Eaton Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with Recreation Road, thence northward along the centre of Recreation Road to its junction with Earlham Road, thence eastward along the centre of Earlham Road to its junction with Edinburgh Road, thence northward along the centre of Edinburgh Road to its junction with Stafford Street, thence westward along the centre of Stafford Street to its junction with Helena Road, thence northward along the centre of Helena Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Earlham Ward.*

"Commencing at a point on the City boundary at its intersection with Dereham Road, thence eastward along the centre of Dereham Road to its junction with the boundary of Nelson Ward, thence southward, westward and southward following the western boundary of Nelson Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Eaton Ward, thence south-westward following the boundary of Eaton Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the City boundary, thence westward and northward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Heigham Ward.*

"Commencing at a point on the City boundary on the northwest at its intersection with the River Wensum, thence southward, eastward and southward along the centre of

the River Wensum to its junction with the boundary of Westwick Ward, thence south-westward, north-westward, south-westward, westward and southward following the boundary of Westwick Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the northern boundary of Nelson Ward, thence westward following the northern boundaries of Nelson Ward and Earlham Ward both as hereinbefore defined to the junction of the boundary of Earlham Ward with the City boundary, thence north-eastward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Hellesdon Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the City boundary at its intersection with Aylsham Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Aylsham Road to its junction with the boundary of Coslany Ward, thence southward and north-westward following the boundary of Coslany Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Heigham Ward in the centre of the River Wensum, thence north-westward, westward and northward following the boundary of Heigham Ward, as hereinbefore defined to its intersection with the City boundary, thence north-eastward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Catton Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the City boundary at its junction with St. Clement Hill, thence southward along the centre of St. Clement Hill and Magdalen Road to the junction of Magdalen Road with the boundary of Coslany Ward, thence westward and north-westward following the northern boundary of Coslany Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Hellesdon Ward, thence north-westward following the boundary of Hellesdon Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the City boundary, thence eastward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Mousehold Ward.*

" Commencing at a point on the City boundary at its junction with Gurney Road, thence westward following the northern boundaries of Thorpe Ward and Fye Bridge Ward to the junction of the boundary of Fye Bridge Ward with the eastern boundary of Coslany Ward, thence northward following the eastern boundaries of Coslany Ward and Catton Ward both as hereinbefore defined to the junction of the boundary of Catton Ward with the City boundary, thence northward, eastward and south-eastward following the City boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*" Plan delineating Boundaries.*

" The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

" In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

† III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"1. If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

"2. If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at an election of Councillors of the City to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the City to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election."

And whereas the said Scheme has been submitted to His Majesty in Council for approval:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby approve of the said Scheme of the said Commissioner, and doth order the same to be published in the London Gazette accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 11th day of February, 1932, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 17th day of March, 1932, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Nuneaton should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be eight:

And whereas on the 12th day of April, 1932, the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Samuel, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Nuneaton:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 11th day of July, 1932:—

"SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF NUNEATON AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS, IN PURSUANCE OF ORDER IN COUNCIL DATED THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH, 1932, AND INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

"In the following descriptions:—

"The Borough Boundary' means the boundary of the Borough of Nuneaton as extended by the Borough of Nuneaton (Extension) Order, 1931.

"*Attleborough Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the Wem Brook at its junction with the Borough boundary on the south; thence northward along the centre of the Wem Brook to its junction with the River Anker; thence eastward along the centre of the River Anker to its junction with the Borough boundary; thence eastward, southward, and westward, following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"*St. Nicholas Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Anker at its junction with the northern boundary of the Borough; thence north-eastward, south-eastward, south-westward and southward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with the River Anker; thence westward and north-westward along the centre of the River Anker to a point immediately under the centre of the bridge leading to Mill Walk; thence westward along the centre of the said bridge and continuing along the centre of Mill Walk to its junction with Coventry Street; thence northward along the centre of Coventry Street to its junction with the Market Place; thence westward along the centre of the Market Place and continuing along the centre of Queen's Road to the junction of Queen's Road with Broad Street; thence northward along the centre of Broad Street to its junction with High Street; thence north-eastward along the centre of High Street to its junction with Abbey Street; thence north-westward along the centre of Abbey Street to its junction with Newtown Road; thence north-eastward and eastward along the centre of Newtown Road to its junction with the River Anker; thence northward and north-westward along the centre of the River Anker to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"*St. Mary Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Mancetter Road at its junction with the Borough boundary; thence north-eastward and eastward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the River Anker; thence south-eastward, south-westward, eastward, southward, westward, south-westward and southward, following the western boundary of St. Nicholas Ward as hereinbefore defined, to its junction with Queen's Road; thence westward along the centre of Queen's Road to a point immediately above the centre of the Abbey Brook Culvert; thence north-westward

along the centre of the Abbey Brook Course to a point immediately below the centre of Manor Court Road; thence north-eastward along the centre of Manor Court Road to its junction with Midland Road; thence north-westward along the centre of Midland Road to a point immediately above the centre of the Coventry Canal; thence south-westward along the centre of the Coventry Canal to a point immediately below the centre of the track of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, Whitacre and Nuneaton Branch; thence westward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to a point a distance of 1,147 yards from the point last mentioned; thence immediately northward following an imaginary line to its junction with the Bar Pool Brook; thence north-westward along the centre of the Bar Pool Brook to a point immediately below the centre of Bucks Hill; thence northward along the centre of Bucks Hill to its junction with Green Lane; thence north-eastward along the centre of Green Lane to its junction with Camp Hill Road; thence eastward along the centre of Camp Hill Road to its junction with Mancetter Road; thence north-westward along the centre of Mancetter Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Coton Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Queen's Road at its junction with Norman Avenue; thence eastward along the centre of Queen's Road to its junction with the boundary of St. Mary Ward; thence eastward and southward following the boundaries of St. Mary Ward and St. Nicholas Ward both as hereinbefore defined to the intersection of the boundary of St. Nicholas Ward with the centre of the track of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, Coventry and Nuneaton Branch; thence south-westward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to a point directly above the centre of Bridge Street; thence westward along the centre of Bridge Street to a point immediately above the centre of the Coventry Canal; thence north-westward along the centre of the Coventry Canal to a point immediately opposite the southern boundary of Courtauld's Silk Factory; thence eastward along the said boundary to a point opposite the centre line of Villiers Street; thence south-eastward following the said centre line to its junction with the centre line of Princes Avenue; thence north-eastward along the centre of Princes Avenue to its junction with Norman Avenue; thence north-westward along the centre of Norman Avenue to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Arbury Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Croft Road immediately above the centre of the Coventry Canal; thence south eastward along the centre of the Coventry Canal to its junction with the western boundary of Coton Ward; thence south-eastward, eastward and north-eastward following the boundary of Coton Ward hereinbefore defined to its junction with St. Nicholas Ward; thence south-eastward following the boundaries of St. Nicholas Ward and Attleborough Ward, both as hereinbefore defined, to the junction of the boundary of Attleborough Ward with the Borough boundary; thence south-westward,

westward and north-westward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with Ansley Road; thence eastward and north-eastward along the centres of Ansley Road, Arbury Road and Croft Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Stockingford Ward.*

"Commencing at a point in the centre of Whittleford Road immediately over the centre of the track of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, Whitacre-Nuneaton Branch; thence eastward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to a point immediately over the centre of the Coventry Canal; thence southward and south-eastward along the centre of the said Canal to a point immediately under the centre of Croft Road; thence south-westward and westward following the boundary of Arbury Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with Church Road; thence northward along the centre of Church Road to its junction with Webb Street, thence eastward along the centre of Webb Street to its junction with Cross Street; thence northward and north-eastward along the centre of Cross Street, to its junction with Haunchwood Road; thence north-westward along the centre of Haunchwood Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

*"Manor Ward.*

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made as aforesaid by the foreign Power named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order and as respects the territory belonging to that Power named in the second column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of the Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. The Power named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is a party to the said Convention.

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report as to an alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of King-

ston and Lewes, Saint John the Baptist, Southover, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chichester and therein recommended the transfer to the said Parish of Lewes, Saint John the Baptist, Southover, of a part of the said Parish of Kingston and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Chichester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Lewes, Saint John the Baptist, Southover, is now full, the Reverend Douglas Gilbert Matthews being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Kingston with Iford is at present vacant:

“And whereas there is at present a pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Kingston with Iford in favour of the Reverend Arthur Gordon Green, a former Incumbent thereof:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Douglas



Gilbert Matthews (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Lewes, Saint John the Baptist, Southover, all that part of the said Parish of Kingston which is situate within the area of the Municipal Borough of Lewes.

“2. That upon the date of the said alteration of boundaries taking effect as aforesaid or upon the date of the cessation of the pension at present charged upon the revenues of the said United Benefice of Kingston with Iford as aforesaid whichever date shall be the later there shall be severed or diverted from the said United Benefice of Kingston with Iford

and transferred to and appropriated for the benefit of the said Benefice of Lewes, Saint John the Baptist, Southover, all those Tithe Rentcharges commuted at £5 5s. 4d. now payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Kingston with Iford and more particularly described in the Schedule annexed to this Scheme together with all capital sums of money, stocks, securities or other property, being or representing the produce of any sales, redemptions or other conversions of any or all such Tithe Rentcharges.

“Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas there is at present within the limits of the said proposed District one consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and it is intended that such Church or Chapel shall be used as a Chapel of Ease to the permanent Church which is to be erected within and for the said proposed District.

“And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 17th day of March, 1932, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month the Benefice of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, and the Benefice of All Souls, Marylebone, in the said County and Diocese were united into one Benefice; and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things (1) that an ecclesiastical district should be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which a Church should be built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales of the sites and materials of the Church and the Parsonage House of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, (2) that when a Church for such District has been built it shall be dedicated to Saint Andrew, and that the Patronage thereof shall be vested in the Patron of the Benefice of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, and (3) that an annual sum of £160 formerly payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, shall be held and

applied by us for the endowment of such Church and District:

“And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which a Church shall be built as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

“And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111.

“And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Andrew, Marylebone, is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of ‘The District of Saint Andrew, Kingsbury’.

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said lastly mentioned Order in Council, be vested in and exercised by Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever.

“And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of Saint Andrew, Kingsbury, being:—

“All that part of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the south-west partly by the Parish of Willesden and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, Wembley, upon the west partly

by the last named New Parish and partly by the District Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Wembley Park, upon the north partly by the Parish of Kingsbury and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, West Hendon, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, West Hendon, from the said New Parish of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury at the junction of Edgware Road with the North Circular Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the North Circular Road for a distance of 74 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Aboyne Road, and extending thence first westward and thence south westward along the middle of Aboyne Road for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Neasden Lane and West Way, and extending thence south westward along the middle of West Way for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chesham Street and Village Way, and continuing thence south westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the line of the Metropolitan Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury from the said Parish of Willesden."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish of Neasden-cum-Kingsbury, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day

of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Archiepiscopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Canterbury and known as Old Palace, Canterbury:

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Archiepiscopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Archbishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £400 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Archbishopric of Canterbury:

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having affixed his signature and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Archbishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £400 and that as a security for the same the said Archbishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of fifteen years or until the said sum of £400 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Archbishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twelfth part of the said principal sum of £400 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay

interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury as every succeeding Archbishop of Canterbury, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £400 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the said Archbishop's Residence known as Old Palace, Canterbury.
