

CANCELLATION OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby CANCEL the appointments of the following Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places:—

15th August, 1932.

CANCELLATIONS.

AT SOUTHWICK CRESCENT,
PADDINGTON.

Twelve Hackney Carriages:

First Portion.—Eight carriages, on the East side of roadway, commencing at the lamp post immediately North of the Main West Door of St. John's Church and extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for eight carriages, keeping clear of the foot-crossing to Somers Place.

Front of vehicles toward the South.

Second Portion.—Four carriages, on the East side of roadway, commencing at the lamp post immediately South of the Main West Door of St. John's Church and extending Southward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

15th August, 1932.

AT LEICESTER SQUARE.

Twelve Hackney Carriages:

On the West side of Leicester Square by the enclosure. To commence from a point South of the refuge at the North-west corner of the enclosure, and extending to the West side of the entrance to the enclosure on the South side of the Square, keeping clear of the Water Post at the South-west corner thereof.

No carriage to stand opposite the entrance to the enclosure on the South side of the Square, during the time the gardens are open to the public.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

15th August, 1932.

AT LEICESTER SQUARE.

Fourteen Hackney Carriages:

On the East side of Leicester Square by the enclosure.

To commence from a point South of the Sand-bin at the North-east corner of the enclosure, and extending to the East side of the entrance to the enclosure on the South side of the Square

No carriage to stand opposite the entrance to the enclosure on the South side of the Square during the time the gardens are open to the public.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

17th August, 1932.

AT FINCHLEY ROAD, N.W.

Thirteen Hackney Carriages:

On West side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the South pillar of front gate of No. 113, Finchley Road, extending Southward, by kerb, as far as necessary for thirteen carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

25th August, 1932.

AT DEAN BRADLEY STREET,
WESTMINSTER.

Two Hackney Carriages:

Commencing at Eastern end of Dean Bradley Street, and extending along centre of road.

Front of vehicles facing St. John's Church.
