The KING has been pleased to grant unto George Rice Pryse of Glanrhydw in the Parish of Llandefeilog in the County of Carmarthen, formerly a Captain in the Welsh Horse Regiment of Yeomanry in the Commission of the Peace and Deputy Lieutenant for the County of Cardigan and Geraldine Mabel his wife, second daughter and co-heir of Conrad Maxwell McPherson Middleton Abadam of Tymawr in the Parish of Kilkennin in the said County of Cardigan, gentleman, and Susanna Mary, his wife, both deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority that they may henceforth take and use the surname of Saunders in addition to and after that of Pryse and that the said George Rice Pryse may bear the Arms of Saunders quarterly with his own Arms of Pryse and that the said Geraldine Mabel Pryse may bear the Arms of Saunders only and that the said surname and Arms of Pryse-Saunders may likewise be taken borne and used by the issue of their marriage, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.
