TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers at present set out in the Schedule to their Notice J. (53), dated 19th May, 1931.

Full particulars of the proposed variation may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board WILL CONSIDER ANY OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 4th October, 1932. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1. It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
