

Electricity Commission.—1932.

WALSALL ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

(The supply of electricity by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walsall within part of the said Borough and parts of the parishes of Bentley and Great Barr both in the rural district of Walsall in the county of Stafford; Repeal of Orders under section 6 of the Electric Lighting Act 1909: Breaking-up of streets; Incorporation of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walsall (who are hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation" and whose address is The Council House, Walsall) intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928, for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply of the Corporation under the Walsall Electricity Orders 1890 and 1924 by adding thereto:—

(a) So much of the Borough of Walsall (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough") as is comprised within a line commencing at the point where the boundary of the Borough prior to the 1st day of April 1931 crossed the south-westerly boundary of the Grand Junction Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway at the Wednesbury Forge Mill Stream, thence along the said borough boundary to a point on the easterly side of the Rushall Canal where such boundary meets the existing boundary of the Borough, and thence along the last-named boundary in a westerly and north-westerly direction to the point of commencement of the said line;

(b) So much of the Borough as is situate between the Borough boundary as constituted on the 1st day of April 1931 and the Borough boundary as constituted immediately before that date between a point 82 yards or thereabouts north-west of the north-westerly corner of Sneyd Cottage and a point 182 yards or thereabouts south east of the easterly end of Anson Bridge;

(c) So much of the Parish of Bentley in the Rural District of Walsall in the county of Stafford as is comprised within a line commencing on the boundary of the Borough at its junction with the boundary between the parishes of Essington and Bentley adjacent to the Wyrley and Essington Canal; thence along the last-named boundary in a westerly direction to its junction with the boundary between the parishes of Short Heath and Bentley; thence along the last-named boundary in a southerly direction to a point opposite the southern boundary of Field Number 24A on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance map for the parish of Bentley (Edition 1914) thence along the southern boundaries of Fields Numbers 24A, 24, 26, 27 and 28 on the said map, thence in an imaginary straight line across Fields Numbers 35 and 29 on the said map and the Wyrley and Essington Canal to a point approximately four hundred and sixty feet south of the south end of Sneyd Junction Bridge on the

boundary of the Borough; and thence in a northerly direction along that boundary to the point of commencement of the said line;

(d) So much of the Parish of Great Barr in the said Rural District and County as is comprised within a line commencing at the junction of Lindens Road and Factory Road, thence proceeding in a north-easterly direction along the centre of Lindens Road to a point approximately one hundred and sixty-five yards south-west of the Old Chester Road; thence proceeding in an imaginary straight line to a point in Foley Wood approximately four hundred and eighty yards south of the south-easterly corner of Yewtree Cottages in Foley Road; thence proceeding in an imaginary straight line to a point in Wood Lane four hundred and fifty yards or thereabouts south-west of the junction of Hardwick Road and Wood Lane, thence proceeding in a south-westerly and westerly direction along the centre of Wood Lane and Foley Road to the junction of Foley Road and Factory Road, and thence proceeding in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Factory Road to and terminating at the point of commencement of the said line.

The foregoing areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added area."

2. To authorise the Corporation to supply, distribute and sell electrical energy for public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 within the added area.

3. To extend and make applicable to the added area all or some of the provisions contained in the Walsall Electricity Orders 1890 and 1924 and in the Walsall Corporation Act 1900, the Walsall Corporation Act 1914, and the Walsall Corporation Act 1919, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein and to repeal or amend so far as may be deemed expedient any Order made by the Electricity Commissioners under the provisions of Section 6 of the Electric Lighting Act 1909 in relation to the supply of electricity by the Corporation to any premises within the added area.

4. To incorporate in the Order some or all of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, with such modifications and exceptions as may be indicated in the Order.

5. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928 and enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

6. To authorise the Corporation in the added area to open and break up streets which are not repairable by the local authority.
