COTTON WASTE RECLAMATION TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April,

1927, the Cotton Waste Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for male and female workers at present in operation and set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice C.W. (19), dated 2nd April, 1931.
