MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

STAPLES FOR STAPLING MACHINES.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require imported stationers' sundries of the following descriptions:

Staples for stapling machines

to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS) EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 1), 1932.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3, sub-section (2) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, they have given a Direction in the following terms:—

Whereas by Section 3, subsection (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. V. c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto;

And whereas it is provided *inter alia* by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 8 Order, 1932,* that it shall not be lawful to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any imported toys unless they bear an indication of origin;

And whereas the Board of Trade, being the Appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in

that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 1 of the said Order to toys in the possession of the said persons prior to the 1st June, 1932, is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 8 Order, 1932, shall not apply to any toy when sold or exposed for sale by any person before the 1st January, 1933, provided that such toy is proved to have been in the possession of such person before the 1st June, 1932.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 1), 1932.
