## AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

ORDER DEFINING THE BENEFITS OR ADVANTAGES WHICH MAY BE RECKONED AS PAYMENT OF WAGES IN LIEU OF PAYMENT IN CASH.

The West Riding of Yorkshire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder do by this Order vary as from 24th November, 1932, their Order of 7th October, 1929, defining the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, which

for the purposes of the said Act shall be deemed to include the cities and county boroughs of Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, Wakefield and York, and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Dewsbury, Doncaster, Halifax, Huddersfield and Rotherham, so as to provide that such benefits or advantages and the values at which they are to be so reckoned shall be as follows:—

- A. Benefits or Advantages.
  - (i) Milk (new and skimmed).
  - (ii) Potatoes.

(iii) Board (including any meals but not including intoxicating drinks) and
