UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 18th OCTOBER, 1932.

WHEREAS it is expedient that women should be eligible for membership of Committees for the Nomination of Examiners and of the body of Curators of the Taylor Institution: NOW THE UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

THE WARWICKSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES)
SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 22 of the Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments, and prescribe the 1st day of November, 1932, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

THE WARWICKSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") shall be amended as follows:—

1. Paragraph (viii) of Clause 8 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new paragraph (viii) shall be substituted therefor:—

(viii) After the standard tonnages of the coal mines and colliery undertakings shall have been determined as aforesaid, every owner shall declare by notice in writing to the Secretary the monthly or quarterly proportions (as the Board may decide) in which he requires the Board to distribute the standard tonnage of his coal mine or colliery undertaking for the year ending on the 31st day of December then next, and for every year thereafter until further notice, and if the Board shall be satisfied that such declared distributions are not prejudicial to the interests of other owners they shall fix such declared distributions as the monthly or quarterly (as the case may be) proportions of the standard tonnages of the coal mines concerned. If the Board shall not be satisfied with such declared distributions it shall be at liberty to make such amendments therein as it shall deem expedient, and shall fix the monthly or quarterly proportions of the standard tonnages of the coal mines or colliery undertakings concerned accordingly. After the Board shall have fixed such monthly or quarterly proportions of the standard tonnages, the same shall not be altered by the owner concerned during the year in question save with the sanction of the Board and in the manner so sanctioned.

In the fixing of monthly or quarterly proportions of the standard tonnages as aforesaid regard shall be had to the special circumstances of every coal mine or colliery undertaking as mentioned in paragraph (iv) of this Clause.

2. Clause 9 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause shall be substituted therefor:—

Quotas and Allocations.

9. (i) As soon as the District allocation has been made the Board shall determine the proportion of the standard tonnage of every coal mine or colliery undertaking (hereinafter referred to as "the quota") which may be produced during the period in respect of which the quota is determined (hereinafter referred to as "the quota period") having regard among other matters to the respective monthly or quarterly proportions of standard tonnage applicable to the quota period under paragraph (viii) of Clause 8 of the Scheme and to the estimated demand

for the coal of the District during the quota period and to the output permissible under the District allocation.

- (ii) If separate standard tonnages have been determined by the Board for any class or classes of coal the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for any or all of such classes of coal.
- (iii) Where the quota for coal or any class of coal is determined by the Board in respect of a colliery undertaking, the owner of the colliery undertaking may allocate in such manner as he requires among his coal mines comprised therein the production of the tonnage authorised by such quota.
- (iv) Every quota period may be fixed by the Board at their discretion and shall be a period not exceeding three months and not less than one month, and every determination of quota shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than fourteen days before the commencement of the quota period to which it relates.
- (v) All quotas so determined for any quota period shall be the same proportion of the respective standard tonnages of coal or of the class of coal (as the case may be) for all coal mines or colliery undertakings.
- (vi) The Board may from time to time at its discretion apply to the Central Council for an increase of the District allocation, and, if the Central Council shall grant any such increase, the Board shall have the same rights and powers over and in respect of such increase as it had over and in respect of the District allocation before such increase was granted.

(vii) All quotas shall be so calculated that, during any period for which a District allocation has been made, that allocation shall not be exceeded.

(viii) The Board may at any time during the course of any quota period increase the quota applicable to coal or to any class of coal and such increase shall apply for any unexpired remainder of such period or for such part thereof as the Board may prescribe. The notice required under paragraph (iv) of this Clause shall not apply to such increase, but the increase shall be notified to all the owners in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

(ix) Save as hereinafter provided, should the output of any owner fall short of the tonnage permitted by the quota for the quota period in respect of coal, or, if separate quotas have been determined, in respect of any class of coal, he shall be entitled (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under the provisions of this paragraph and for any tonnage acquired under the provisions of Clause 10 of the Scheme) to carry forward the amount of the shortage as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the quota for coal or for any class of coal (as the case may be) for the next or any succeeding quota period:

Provided always that any shortage shall not be carried forward beyond the end of any period for which a District allocation has been determined.

3. The heading of Clause 10 of the Scheme shall be amended as follows:—

The word "Allocations" shall be deleted and the word "Quotas" shall be substituted therefor.

4. Clause 11 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following new Clause 11 shall be substituted therefor:—

Output.

- 11. The total output of each coal mine or colliery undertaking shall be ascertained at the end of each quota period, and for that purpose every owner shall forward to the Secretary within seven days after the end of such period a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving full particulars of the output of his coal mine or undertaking during the period in question together with such other particulars as may be necessary for ascertaining any excess of output over the quota for coal or for any class of coal during the period. If in any case the output has exceeded the tonnage permitted by the quota for coal or for any class of coal (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under paragraph (ix) of Clause 9 and any transfer of quota effected under Clause 10 of the Scheme) the owner of the coal mine or colliery undertaking shall be liable in respect of such excess to the penalties prescribed in Clause 21 of the
- 5. Paragraph (i) of Clause 21 of the Scheme, and so much of paragraph (iii) of that clause as precedes sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of the said paragraph (iii), shall be amended so as to read respectively as follows:—
 - (i) Any owner who raises or allows to be raised from his coal mine or colliery undertaking during a quota period an output of coal or of any class of coal in excess of that permitted by the quota for the coal or for that class of coal (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 9 (ix) and any transfer of quota under Clause 10 of the Scheme) shall become liable to and shall pay a penalty of three shillings per ton for every ton of such excess.

In addition to any monetary penalty payable under this Clause where coal or any class of coal is produced in excess of the quota for any period, the quota for the coal mine or colliery undertaking in respect of coal or of the particular class of coal (as the case may be) may be reduced, at the discretion of the Board, by the amount of the excess during such succeeding quota period as the Board may determine.

(iii) If any owner shall fail to supply full particulars of his total output of coal, or, if separate classes of coal have been determined, of each such class, during any period together with any further particulars necessary for ascertaining any surplus output, or shall fail to give particulars of all sales and deliveries made by him during the period, including deliveries to collieries for consumption and all allowances made for short weight, dirt and the like during such period, as provided by Clauses 11 and 16 respectively of the Scheme, or shall fail to supply any returns, accounts or other information required by the Board under the provisions

of the Scheme, for a period of seven days after he shall have received notice of his default from the Secretary, he shall become liable to and shall pay the following penalty:—

REGULATIONS FOR A SPECIAL COMPETITION BY SELECTION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT ENGINEERS (MALE) IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

N.B.—These regulations are intended to apply to the forthcoming competition only.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st September, 1932. In reckoning age for this purpose candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years during which they have served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and up-bringing with his Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Other things being equal preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

Audio frequency electrical measurements. Transmission measurements. Microphones and receivers. Telephone repeaters. Carrier systems. Voice frequency systems. Electrical filters. Acoustic measurements. Power interference. Electrolytic damage. Telephone cables. Radio telephones.

8. When the list of applications has been closed, the credentials of all the candidates will be examined by the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if they so desire, invite the assistance of officers of the General Post Office; and those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend, for the vacancies existing, those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Board will be constituted by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the General Post Office, who will be represented on the Board.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period probation to the satisfaction of the
