APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan, Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Hackney Carriages at the following place, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz.:—

12th October, 1932.

APPOINTMENT.

At St. John's Square, South of Clerkenwell Road.

Three Hackney Carriages:

On West side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with North entrance to Methodist Central Hall, extending Southward, by kerb, as far as necessary for three carriages. Front of vehicles toward the North.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

REGULATIONS MADE ON THE 12TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1932, FOR THE CONTROL OF THE ADMIRALTY WATERS AT GIBRALTAR, AS DEFINED BY ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 22ND MARCH, 1911.

The following shall be substituted for the Regulations dated 19th August, 1926.

The limits of the Admiralty waters are as follows:—

All the water area lying between the Admiralty Harbour Works, the North Mole, and the shore, together with the water area extending from the outer edge of low water for a width of 200 yards outside the same from Rosia Mole on the South to the South end of the West Arm of the North Mole—including the Northern Entrance—and for a width of 50 yards outside the faced wall of the North Mole.

The term King's Harbour Master used in these regulations includes any person for the time being performing the duties of Harbour Master under the direction of the Senior Naval Officer.

The term approved pilot used in these regulations means a pilot approved by the Senior Naval Officer or the King's Harbour Master in accordance with the provisions of clause 2 hereof

- 1. No merchant or other private vessel shall enter Admiralty Waters without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.
- 2. The Senior Naval Officer, or King's Harbour Master, shall be the authority for approving pilots for the purpose of conducting ships within the Admiralty Waters at Gibraltar; and it shall be lawful for the said Senior Service may demand.

Naval Officer, or King's Harbour Master, from time to time to make and, when made, to alter or revoke, such regulations, in writing, as he may deem expedient, for the examination of such pilots for their, suitability for the performance of pilotage within the Admiralty Waters of Gibraltar.

- 3. No merchant or other private vessel shall enter, anchor, berth, moor, navigate within, or leave Admiralty waters without having on board an approved pilot. When in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master the use of tugs is necessary to carry out any movement of a vessel with safety, such tugs must have been previously approved by him as suitable for such work, and in the event of Admiralty tugs being employed an Admiralty pilot will always be placed in charge of the movement. The Admiralty shall determine the amount which shall be paid for the service of any tugs belonging to or employed by the Admiralty attending and assisting the vessel and the cost or price or hire of any Dockyard labour or materials or apparatus supplied by the Admiralty.
- 4. Notwithstanding any enactment or order to the contrary, no pilot acting as such on board a merchant or private vessel shall be deemed to be a servant of the Admiralty, even though in the course of his ordinary duties he may be such a servant.
- 5. Nothwithstanding anything in any enactment or order to the contrary the owners or masters of a vessel entering, anchoring, berthing, mooring, navigating within or leaving the Admiralty Waters with an approved pilot on board shall be answerable for any loss or damage caused by the vessel in the same manner as they would be if the employment of such a pilot were not compulsory.
- 6. When any of H.M. Ships (or vessels moving under direct orders of the King's Harbour Master) are about to enter or leave Admiralty Waters the following signals will be displayed at the Dockyard Tower by direction of the Senior Naval Officer and repeated at the Lighthouses at the North end of the South Mole and at the South end of the North Mole:—

If the North entrance only is being.used.— By day: A square red flag; By night: A red light.

If the South entrance only is being used.— By day: A square green flag; By night: A green light.

If both entrances are being used.—By day: Both the above signals vertically; By night: Both the above signals vertically.

When these signals are displayed, no merchant or other private vessel shall attempt to enter, leave or move within Admiralty Waters in the vicinity of the entrance indicated until such time as the signals are hauled down.

Note.—At the lighthouses referred to above, these signals will be displayed in a position vertically above the navigational light.

7. Moorings for H.M. Ships, mark buoys or other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval or military operations, shall be placed by the King's Harbour Master, as from time to time the requirements of H.M. Service may demand.

- 8. Moorings for private vessels may be laid with the permission, in writing, of the King's Harbour Master, and in such positions as he shall deem fit, but such moorings shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.
- 9. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master or other person in charge or command of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.
- 10. No merchant or other private vessel or boat shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the Government quays, wharves, buoys, piles, or mark buoys, without permission, in writing, from the King's Harbour Master.
- 11. No ballast, stones, sand, earth, clay, refuse, ash, rubbish, dust, sewage matter, nor filth of any description, and no refuse from any quarry, mine or pit, nor any other material, shall, except in such places and subject to such conditions as may be approved by the King's Harbour Master, be unladen, cast or allowed to fall or to be washed into the Admiralty waters.
- 12. The steam syren shall not be used within Admiralty waters except to prevent collision or in case of fog.
- 13. A merchant or other private vessel having on board as cargo any privately-owned explosives, petroleum or highly inflammable goods, if permitted by the King's Harbour Master to enter Admiralty Waters, shall show a red flag by day or a red light by night at the foremast head, and shall embark two guards supplied by the Captain of the Port, for whom payment shall be made by the master or other person in charge of the vessel, before clearance, at such rates as may at the time be in force.

Without the permission in writing of the King's Harbour Master, no explosives, petroleum, or highly inflammable cargo shall be discharged, landed or transhipped. Except to discharge or load cargo, hatches of holds in which petroleum, explosives or highly inflammable goods are stored shall not be removed, and if hatches be removed to discharge or load cargo all proper precautions are to be taken to prevent any possibility of accident.

If the master or person in charge of the vessel shall omit to comply with the foregoing instructions or to take all proper precautions to prevent any possibility of accident, he will be liable to a fine in accordance with clause 14 of the Order in Council of the 22nd of March, 1911, and the vessel shall be liable to be removed from Admiralty Waters at the expense of the owners and in such manner as the King's Harbour Master may direct.

14. All merchant or other private vessels within Admiralty waters shall carry out such instructions as they may receive from time to time from the King's Harbour Master or other officer acting on his behalf, with respect to putting out fires or lights, or other precautions deemed necessary for the prevention of fire.

- 15. No fire-arms or air guns shall be discharged on any ship or other vessel or boat within Admiralty waters.
- 16. No ship's gun on board any merchant or other private vessel shall be kept loaded nor discharged, except as a signal of distress, within Admiralty waters.
- 17. No trawling nor fishing by nets, whether drift nets or set nets, shall be at any time carried on in the Admiralty waters without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.
- 18. All seagoing vessels, when within the limits of the Admiralty waters, shall carry such lights as are prescribed by the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" made from time to time under the Imperial Merchant Shipping Acts, and all vessels of every description shall also observe the steering and sailing rules set forth in such regulations.
- 19. The master of every merchant or other private vessel, or person in charge of any boat to which these regulations apply, shall observe, and cause to be observed, these regulations as far as they apply to his vessel or boat; and if any master, or other person, acts in any respect in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to observe or cause to be observed in any respect any of these regulations, he will be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, in accordance with clause 14 of the said Order in Council.
