WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the Twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of the provisions of The Bank Holidays Act, 1871, and The Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, Do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the Twenty-seventh day of December next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

REVOKING, SO FAR AS IT RELATES TO OUR UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA, THE PROCLAMATION OF 23RD JANUARY, 1911, APPLYING PARTS OF THE COINAGE ACT, 1870, TO OUR UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA AND TO BASUTOLAND.

Whereas by virtue of a Proclamation of His Majesty dated the 23rd day of January, 1911, (hereinafter called "the Proclamation") certain parts of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by section two and the schedule of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied, with the modifications specified in the Proclamation, to Our Union of South Africa and to Basutoland:

And whereas by virtue of the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made under that Act:

And whereas provision respecting the currency of Our Union of South Africa is made by Acts of Our Union of South Africa and Our Ministers in Our Union of South Africa have requested that the said Proclamation be revoked:

Now, therefore, We, with the advice of Our Privy Council in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that

behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain, as follows:—

(1) The Proclamation so far as relates to Our Union of South Africa is hereby revoked and accordingly the said Act shall cease to apply to and to be in force in Our Union of South Africa.

(2) This Proclamation may be cited as the Union of South Africa (Coinage) Proclamation 1932.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Hopesay and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Edgton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hopesay and Edgton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Hereford embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Hopesay is now full, the Reverend Arthur Clement Buss being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Edgton is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Arthur Clement Buss (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Hopesay and the said Benefice of Edgton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hopesay with Edgton' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Clun, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Arthur Clement Buss if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hopesay shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hopesay shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Edgton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the first vacation of the United Benefice a portion of the endowments or property of the United Benefice that is to say the sum of £2,502 14s. 10d. Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the said Benefice of Hopesay, shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated and held by us as to one moiety of such Stock for the augmentation of the Benefice of Clunbury, in the said Diocese of Hereford, and as to the other moiety of such Stock for the augmentation of the Benefice of Churchstoke, in the said Diocese of Hereford.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Hopesay shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Edgton shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Kyre Wyard and Stoke Bliss duly made their Report to the said

Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Worcester embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard is now full, the Reverend Joseph William Churchill being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss in favour of the Reverend Henry Ward Watson, a former Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard and the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stoke Bliss with Kyre' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss and the then Incumbent of Kyre Wyard shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss shall have been instituted to Stoke Bliss subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of

Kyre Wyard shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Kyre Wyard having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stoke Bliss having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"5. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of any pension out of the income of the United Benefice payable to the said Henry Ward Watson whichever shall the later happen all the endowments other than glebe belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the two Benefices of Clifton on Teme and Rochford, both in the said Diocese of Worcester, with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Clifton on Teme, and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £28 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Rochford; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect or as from the date of the cessation of any pension to the said Henry Ward Watson as aforesaid (as the case may be) due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Clifton on Teme and Rochford respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Clifton on Teme and Rochford or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Clifton on Teme and Rochford and their successors shall have and



be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him grant, convey and annex to the said Benefices of Clifton on Teme and Rochford or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Worcester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in any case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Beckingham is now full, the Reverend John Joseph Gay being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Stubton is at present vacant:

"And whereas the share of the Patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which on a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patron of the said Benefice of Beckingham would in our opinion be negligible:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Stubton and a part of the said Benefice of Beckingham namely all that part of the said Benefice of Beckingham which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Fenton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stubton with Fenton'.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Stubton shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Stubton shall (until revised or

altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Beckingham shall be vacant the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall take effect forthwith, and if such Benefice shall not be then vacant the said union shall take effect whenever the Incumbent thereof shall signify in writing to the Bishop his consent to such union taking effect as provided in this Scheme and in the absence of such consent the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Beckingham, and the Incumbent (if any) of the said Benefice of Stubton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stubton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

That upon the union taking effect a portion of the endowment and property of the said Benefice of Beckingham namely a sum of £1,500 Southern Railway £5 per centum per annum Perpetual Debenture Stock (being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the said Benefice of Beckingham) shall be transferred from the said Benefice of Beckingham and shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Stubton with Fenton.
