point where it meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the Melton Constable and Norwich Line of the Midland and Great Northern Joint Railway, and extending thence in a straight line due south (thereby crossing such line of railway) for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Wensum upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hellesdon from the said Parish of Heigham.

"III. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.
