And whereas by the District Registries (Poole and Bournemouth) Order in Council, 1920, it was ordered that there should be a District Registry of the High Court at Bournemouth and that the district of the said District Registry should be the Court District of the County Court of Dorsetshire and Hampshire held at Poole and Bournemouth:

And whereas by the County Court Districts (Miscellaneous No. 2) Order, 1932, which came into operation on the 1st July, 1932, it was ordered that the County Court of Dorsetshire and Hampshire held at Poole and Bournemouth should be divided into two separate districts and that a Court should be held in each of the separately constituted districts by the names of the County Court of Dorsetshire held at Poole and the County Court of Hampshire held at Bournemouth respectively:

And whereas for the removal of doubts it is desirable to define again the district of the said District Registry at Bournemouth:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows.—

1. There shall be a District Registry of the High Court at Bournemouth, and the district thereof shall be the area comprising the Court districts of the County Court of Dorsetshire held at Poole and the County Court of Hampshire held at Bournemouth.

2. The District Registries (Pool and Bournemouth) Order in Council, 1920, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the District Registries (Bournemouth) Order, 1932, and shall be read with the District Registries Order in Council, 1899, which shall have effect as amended by this Order.

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders, as amended, should be further amended in the manner further appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, as amended, shall have effect and be deemed always to have had effect as if after Article I (XVII) (f) there were inserted the following further sub-paragraph:—

"(g) In the construction of this paragraph the liability of the Property, Rights and Interests mentioned in Article I (XVI) hereof to be retained or liquidated by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, pursuant to Article 297 of the Treaty, shall be deemed to be a charge thereon and to form part of the charge created by Article I (XVI) hereof".

2. The Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, as amended, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended, shall respectively have effect and be deemed always to have had effect as if after Article I (X) (h) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, as amended, there were inserted the following further sub-paragraph:—

"(i) In the construction of this paragraph the liability of the Property, Rights and Interests mentioned in Article I (IX) hereof to be retained or liquidated by the United

Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, pursuant to Article 249 of the Treaty, shall be deemed to be a charge thereon and to form part of the charge created by Article I (IX) hereof",

as if, after Article I (II) (z) of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, as amended, the following further sub-paragraph were inserted:—

"(j) In the construction of this paragraph the liability of the Property, Rights and Interests mentioned in Article I (I) hereof to be retained or liquidated by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, pursuant to Article 177 of the Treaty, shall be deemed to be a charge thereon and to form part of the charge created by Article I (I) hereof",

and as if after Article I (X) (j) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended, the following further sub-paragraph were inserted:—

"(k) In the construction of this paragraph the liability of the Property, Rights and Interests mentioned in Article I (IX) hereof to be retained or liquidated by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, pursuant to Article 232 of the Treaty, shall be deemed to be a charge thereon and to form part of the charge created by Article I (IX) hereof".

3. This Order may be cited as the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) Order, 1932, and shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1932, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1932, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1932, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1932.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in or over that part of Africa known as the Nyasaland Protectorate (in this Order referred to as "the Protectorate"):

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 26th day of October, 1931 (in this Order referred to as "the Order of 1931"), it was declared to be expedient to make provision *inter alia* for the use of certain coins as Legal Tender within the Protectorate:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made for the use of certain coins as Legal Tender within the Protectorate:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Nyasaland Protectorate (Coinage) Order in Council, 1932.

2. The Order of 1931 shall have effect as though the following sub-paragraph were inserted after sub-paragraph 3 of Article 2:—

"(4) With the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury and of a Secretary of State to provide that silver coins issued by the Government of the Colony of Southern Rhodesia and declared to be Legal Tender by that Government within that Colony shall be current in the Protectorate, and the tender of payment of money in the Protectorate, if made in any of those coins, shall if the coins have not been illegally dealt with, be a Legal Tender for any amount not exceeding £2 sterling in value."

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is, among other things, provided by subsection (1) of section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1930, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to a person resident in any foreign state through an agency in the United Kingdom or to a person resident in the United Kingdom through an agency in any foreign state are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in that foreign state; and

(b) that arrangements as specified in the declaration have been made with the Government concerned with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation,

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from United Kingdom income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the foreign state, have the effect of law in the foreign state:

And whereas it is enacted by a proviso to the said subsection that no such arrangements as aforesaid shall exempt from United Kingdom income tax any profits or gains which either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(ii) accrue to a person resident in the United Kingdom; or

(iii) accrue to a person not resident in the United Kingdom directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through any agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts:

And whereas the Agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made

between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Swiss Federal Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to persons resident in Switzerland through agencies in the United Kingdom or to persons resident in the United Kingdom through agencies in Switzerland are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in Switzerland; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Agreement have been made with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Agency Profits (Switzerland) Declaration, 1932".

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE SWISS FEDERAL COUNCIL.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Swiss Federal Council, being desirous of concluding an Agreement for reciprocal exemption from taxation in certain cases of profits or gains arising through an agency and by this means of facilitating the conclusion of a general Agreement for the avoidance of double taxation, have appointed to that end as their plenipotentiaries:

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

His Excellency Sir Howard William Kennard, His Britannic Majesty's Minister.

The Swiss Federal Council:

M. Giuseppe Motta, Federal Councillor, Chief of the Federal Political Department,

who having communicated to each other their full powers, found to be in due form, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland undertake that the profits or gains to which this Article relates shall, so long as the exemptions specified in Article 2 hereof remain effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Sur-tax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and will take the necessary action under section seventeen of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1930, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this Article relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the United Kingdom to a person who is resident in Switzerland and is not resident

in the United Kingdom, unless the profits or gains either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(ii) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through an agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 2.

In Switzerland from the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty, and thereafter so long as the exemption specified in Article 1 hereof remains effective, the profits or gains to which this Article relates shall be exempted from all direct taxes on income, whether imposed by the Confederation, the Cantons or the Communes.

Further, from the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty, and thereafter so long as the exemption specified in Article 1 hereof remains effective, any property which is owned or possessed and employed in Switzerland by a person resident in the United Kingdom and not resident in Switzerland for the purpose of making profits or gains to which this Article relates shall be exempted from all direct taxes on property or capital, whether imposed by the Confederation, the Cantons or the Communes.

The profits or gains to which this Article relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in Switzerland to a person who is resident in the United Kingdom and is not resident in Switzerland, unless the profits or gains either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in Switzerland; or

(ii) accrue directly or indirectly through any branch or management in Switzerland or through an agency in Switzerland where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

The existing taxes in Switzerland to which this Article applies are those indicated in the Annex to this Agreement.

Article 3.

For the purposes of this Agreement the word "person" includes any body of persons, corporate or not corporate, and a body corporate shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom and shall be regarded as resident in Switzerland if its business is managed and controlled in Switzerland.

Article 4.

This Agreement may be denounced at any time upon six months' notice being given by one Contracting Party to the other.

Article 5.

This Agreement shall be ratified and the instruments of ratification shall be exchanged at London as soon as possible. This Agreement shall take effect on the exchange of the instruments of ratification.

In witness whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done at Berne in duplicate in the English and French languages, the seventeenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one (17th October, 1931).

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Holton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Bratton Saint Maur, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Holton and Bratton Saint Maur duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union (including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Bratton Saint Maur and the Parish of the Benefice of Charlton Musgrove, in the said County and Diocese) and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Holton and Bratton Saint Maur are now full, the Reverend Henry Beament Fone being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holton and the Reverend George Herbert Griffiths being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bratton Saint Maur:

"And whereas the Patronage of both of the said Benefices of Holton and Bratton Saint Maur is now vested in one and the same body of persons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Holton and the said Benefice of Bratton Saint Maur shall

be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Holton with Bratton Saint Maur' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Cary (District of Bruton) but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Holton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bratton Saint Maur and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That with the consent of Randolph Marriott Leir, of Charlton Goodrich, Ross on Wye, Hereford, Esquire (testified by his signing this Scheme), as the Patron of the said Benefice of Charlton Musgrove, and with the consent of the Reverend Charles Edward Wilson (testified by his signing this Scheme), as the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Charlton Musgrove, upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Charlton Musgrove (containing Holbrooke House, Hollbrooke Farm, Home Wood, Furze Wood and Hook Farm) which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Bratton Seymour shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Bratton Saint Maur.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be

stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend John Augustine, Lord Bishop of Lichfield, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, John Augustine Lord Bishop of Lichfield beg leave to represent to your Grace:—

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament called the 'Pluralities Acts' the Places or Districts or portions of land forming parts of the Parishes of Whitmore, Knutton, Stoke-upon-Trent, Saint Thomas Butterton, Swynnerton, Trent Vale and Hanford all in the Diocese of Lichfield may be advantageously separated therefrom and be united for Ecclesiastical

purposes to the Parishes of Keele, Saint Thomas Butterson and Saint Giles Newcastle-under-Lyme respectively in the Diocese of Lichfield and to which the said Districts or portions of land are contiguous as the Spiritual care of the Inhabitants thereof will thereby be more conveniently and effectually provided for, more especially so as the above mentioned portions of land parts of the Parishes of Stoke-upon-Trent and Hanford are detached portions and the suggested alterations will make as far as possible convenient boundaries for the said Parishes of Keele, Whitmore, Saint Thomas Butterson and Saint Giles Newcastle-under-Lyme respectively.

"That pursuant to the directions of the 26th Section of the Act 1 and 2 Vict. Cap. 106, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1887, I have drawn up in writing a Scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rentcharges and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices of the said Parishes of Keele, Whitmore, Saint Thomas Butterson, Trent Vale, Saint Giles Newcastle-under-Lyme, Swynnerton, Knutton, Stoke-upon-Trent and Hanford to the intent that your Grace, if you shall be satisfied with the said Scheme, certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed:—

"1. That the Districts or portions of land at present part of the Parishes of Whitmore, Knutton, Stoke-upon-Trent (detached) and Saint Thomas Butterson respectively which are shown on the accompanying plan 'A' within the thin red lines and the edged line coloured mauve shall be separated from those respective Parishes and be annexed to and united with the Parish of Keele shown on the accompanying plan 'B' and coloured mauve thereon.

"2. That the District or portion of land at present part of the Parish of Swynnerton which is shown on the said plan 'A' within the thin red line and the edged line coloured blue shall be separated from that Parish and be annexed to and united with the Parish of Saint Thomas Butterson shown on the said plan 'B' and coloured blue thereon.

"3. That the Districts or portions of land at present part of the Parishes of Trent Vale, Hanford (detached), Stoke-upon-Trent (detached), Knutton and Saint Thomas Butterson respectively which are shown on the said plan 'A' within the thin red lines and the edged line coloured light green shall be separated from those respective parishes and be annexed to and united with the Parish of Saint Giles

Newcastle-under-Lyme shown on the said plan 'B' and coloured light green thereon.

"4. That the Boundaries of the Parishes of Trent Vale, Swynnerton and Knutton coloured respectively pink, dark brown and light brown on the said plan 'B' shall now be altered as so coloured thereon.

"5. That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said Districts or portions of land referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme in the Parish Church of Keele, those for the Inhabitants of the said District or portion of land referred to in Clause 2 in the Parish Church of Saint Thomas Butterson and those for the Inhabitants of the said Districts or portions of land referred to in Clause 3 in the Parish Church of Saint Giles Newcastle-under-Lyme and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical dues offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said respective Districts or portions of land shall belong to the Incumbent of the said Parishes of Keele, Saint Thomas Butterson, and Saint Giles Newcastle-under-Lyme respectively.

"6. That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe lands, Tithes, or Tithe Rentcharges compositions in lieu of Tithes, Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes herein referred to nor in respect to Patronage.

"7.
