PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of November, 1932 (P.M. 343/32), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of Services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, to approve regulations for the grant of pensions and allowances to the widows, children and other dependent relatives of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces:

“And whereas under the aforesaid regulations it is provided that allowances granted to the daughters and sisters of Officers may be

continued until they marry or attain the age of twenty-one whichever shall happen first, and no longer, except in certain special circumstances detailed in the aforesaid regulations:

“And whereas we consider that the normal age limit for the payment of allowances to the daughters and sisters of Officers should be reduced to eighteen:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the amendment of the regulations in the terms of the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

“ SCHEDULE.

“From the date of this Order the normal age limit for the grant or continuance of allowances to daughters and sisters of deceased Naval and Marine Officers shall be 18 years, the age limit applicable to sons, instead of 21 years, subject to the following exception, to which the present age limit of 21 years will continue to apply, viz. :—

Allowances (other than those granted on an attributable basis) to daughters of Officers who have neither

- (i) been promoted to higher rank on the active list, nor
 - (ii) entered the service
- subsequent to the date of this Order.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 434 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, His Majesty by Order in Council dated the 13th day of October, 1910 (S.R. & O. 1910, No. 1113), prescribed certain signals of distress:

And whereas by Sub-section (4) of Section 25 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (hereinafter called the Conventions Act), it is provided that Section 434 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, should cease to have effect, but that any Rules made thereunder should, until revoked, have effect as though they had been made under the provisions of Section 25 of the Conventions Act:

And whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 25 of the Conventions Act, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council prescribe what signals shall be signals of distress:

And whereas it is expedient to prescribe certain additional signals of distress:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Conventions Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased to order, and doth hereby order, as follows:—

1. The following signals of distress for use both in the day time and at night shall be added to those contained in Article 31 of the First Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 13th day of October, 1910.

(1) (a) A signal made by radiotelegraphy or by any other distance signalling method consisting of the group *••• — — — — — •••* in the Morse Code.

(b) A signal sent by radiotelephony consisting of the spoken word "Mayday."

(2) A signal sent by radiotelegraphy in the Morse Code consisting of a series of twelve dashes, each of four seconds duration, transmitted in one minute with an interval of one second between each dash.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 and 53 V. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Distress Signals) Order, 1932, and shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1933.

Several repetitions of the group X X X in the Morse Code sent by radiotelegraphy with the letters of each group and the successive groups clearly separated from each other.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52-3 V. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Urgency Signal) Order, 1932, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1933.

WHEREAS the Legislature of the Colony of Kenya (hereinafter referred to as "the Legislature") has by an Ordinance entitled "The Kenya Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Ordinance, 1931" (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance") made a provision for raising a force for the naval defence of the Colony within its territorial waters under the designation of the Kenya Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve:

And whereas, under the powers conferred by the Imperial Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931, the Legislature has further provided in the Ordinance that

(a) All enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy shall apply within or without the limits of the Colony, to the officers and men of the Reserve during such period as they are under instruction, training or exercise, whether afloat or ashore, within or without the limits of the Colony, or during such period as they are in actual service; and

(b) That the Governor may cause any member of the Reserve to be instructed trained and exercised on shore or on board any ship or vessel or partly on shore and partly on board any ship or vessel, within

or without the limits of the Colony, whether belonging to the Colony or not; and

(c) That the whole or any part of the Reserve shall at all times be liable to be employed on active service against an enemy anywhere within or without the limits of the Colony or for the prevention or suppression of internal disorder within the Colony; and

(d) That the body of officers and men raised in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance shall form part of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve constituted under the Imperial Naval Forces Act, 1903:

And whereas by virtue of sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the said "Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931" these further provisions require the approval of His Majesty in Council in so far as they relate to the matters specified in paragraphs (a) (b) and (c) of the said sub-section:

Now, therefore, His Majesty having taken these further provisions of the Ordinance into consideration is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to give, express, and signify His approval thereof in all respects so far as is required by the said sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said "Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931".

(1) To enable the Corporation to increase, alter or amend the existing authorised rates and charges for the supply of water and the manner of charging therefor as set out in the Schedule annexed hereto; to authorise the Corporation by agreement to supply water

for domestic purposes by measure; to provide that the Corporation shall not be bound to supply with water otherwise than by measure premises partly used for trade or manufacturing purposes, public and private institutions, hospitals, asylums, schools, boarding houses, common lodging houses, clubs, public assembly halls, hotels, public houses, restaurants, hydropathic establishments, and such other classes of premises as the intended Order may prescribe; to authorise special charges for water supplied in connection with refrigerating apparatus; to authorise the Corporation to supply water for other than domestic purposes on such terms and conditions as they may think fit, to supply water for such purposes by measure and to define the meaning of the words "for other than domestic purposes"; to prescribe the basis on which two or more houses or buildings in one occupation shall be assessed for water rates; to authorise additional charges in cases where water supplied for domestic purposes is used for horses or washing carriages or motor cars or for other purposes in stables, garages or premises where horses, carriages or motor cars are kept if a hose pipe or similar apparatus be used and where in these premises and for these purposes water is taken both for domestic purposes and by meter for trade purposes to provide that the Corporation may require water so used to be taken and paid for by measure; to require the payment of water rates by each owner or occupier of several premises which are supplied by one common pipe as if such premises were supplied by a separate pipe; to provide for the payment of water rates by persons giving notice for the discontinuance of the supply of water or removing from their premises between any two quarter days; to make provision for notice of the discontinuance of the supply of water and for the form and service of such notice; to require the payment of water rates by the owners instead of by the occupiers in the case of certain small houses; where a supply of water to a farmhouse is used for farming purposes to enable the Corporation to require that such supply be taken by measure; to make special provision with regard to stand-by supplies and in regard to the supply of water to caravans, shacks, huts, tents or other like structures and as to the security

to be given therefor; to make special provision with regard to the recovery of sums due from persons quitting premises in order to evade payment of water rates; to empower the Minister of Health in certain circumstances by order to vary or increase the rates and charges for the supply of water by the Corporation, and to prescribe or alter the basis upon which the same may be reckoned; to empower the Corporation to prescribe a minimum charge for all or any supplies of water afforded by the Corporation and to prescribe that all moneys payable for the supply of water shall be recoverable at the like dates and in the same manner as water rates; and to provide that the Corporation may include in one and the same demand, complaint, information or summons or in any Schedule thereto any general rate, water rate or other rate or money due from the same person, whether the same are levied due or recoverable under the same or different enactments;
